ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL

It is the time of year when our bishop asks us to support the ministry and programs of the Diocese of Spokane through donations to the Annual Catholic Appeal. This Appeal provides the majority of the revenue with which the diocese carries out its mission, administratively and pastorally.

You can make your donation anytime you wish, using the envelopes you may have received in the mail or that are available in church, or using the on-line option (www.dioceseofspokane.org). Our assessment this year for our parish is \$153,378.00, which is about \$4,000.00 more than our assessment last year. To date, our parishioners have given \$136,635.00, which is 89% of our goal. If we all give as much as we can, we will once again meet our assessed amount.
