Respect Life News: The harmful fallout of physician assisted suicide and euthanasia where either practice is legal, regrettably, can be easily illustrated. In Canada, for example, two months ago, the government of the province of Ontario voted that doctors and nurses must (italics added) participate in euthanasia and assisted suicide if a patient requests it. Mary Jean Martin, a Registered Nurse in Ontario, with 30 years of experience, refused to comply and no longer has a job. As an employee of the government run Local Health Integrated Network, she was told that all healthcare workers would be required to take an oath to observe and comply with the laws of Canada including the euthanasia and assisted suicide law. If they do not sign or take the oath, their noncompliance is taken as an automatic resignation from their position. When she told her superior she could not sign such an oath since she did not agree with the euthanasia and assisted suicide law, she added that she could not even minimally help anyone to kill him or herself or even refer them to someone who would. As a Christian, she declared: “I would rather resign than compromise on my beliefs.” We note another Orwellian development resulting from the legalizing of euthanasia and assisted suicide in the first country in the world to do so, the Netherlands, in 2001(taking effect in 2002). Even one of that country’s very well-known euthanasia advocates, Boudewijn Chabot, who wrote recently that he’s not disturbed if the number of people asking to be euthanized “exceeds tens of thousands in a few years” [!] but that he does “worry” about the increase of patients with dementia being euthanized, “from 12 in 2009 to 141 in 2016, and chronic psychiatric patients from 0 to 60” (National Right to Life News, 6.19.17; the U.K Society for the Protection of Unborn Children (SPUC) news report, 6.22.2017).
