Saint of the week: Francis Xavier, 1506-1552 (Feast, December 3). Known as the Apostle to the Indies and to Japan, Francis was born in Spanish Navarre, the youngest in a large family. He studied at the University of Paris, where he met St. Ignatius of Loyola, and was among the



first seven Jesuits who vowed to be spiritual soldiers for Christ. They were ordained as a group in 1537. For 11 years, from 1541 until his untimely death after only two weeks on the Chinese coast, Francis evangelized in the East Indies, Mozambique,

India, Malaysia, Sri Lanka, Indonesia and Japan. A missionary prone to seasickness who had trouble learning foreign languages, Francis is the patron saint of missionaries, Borneo, the East Indies, India, Pakistan, Japan and Outer Mongolia.

Respect Life News: On November 14, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops elected Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann of the Archdiocese of Kansas City, Kansas, as Chairman of its Committee on Pro-Life Activities. Archbishop Naumann "has been a bold and sometimes controversial advocate for the right to life. Earlier this year, his archdiocese broke ties with the Girl Scouts because of" their "connection to... Planned Parenthood and other abortion activists. The move upset some parents, but the archbishop urged the change anyway. He encouraged schools and parishes to charter with ... American Heritage Girls" (AHG), an "organization for girls... that embraces Christian values and encourages family involvement," whose mission is to develop 'women of integrity through service to God, family and community" Among its alliances with likeminded groups is the National Federation for Catholic Youth Ministry. The Archbishop said his decision was not easy, but he was concerned about the Girl Scouts' promotion of 'troubling trends' in society, including abortion. He also has rebuked Catholic politicians like Tim Kaine and former Kansas Governor and HHS Secretary Kathleen Sebelius because they oppose protections for unborn children. His election has been warmly welcomed by Pro-Life groups. Carol Tobias, president of the National Right to Life Committee, for example, commented "...Archbishop Joseph Naumann has long been a friend to the right-to-life movement, and to National Right to Life (NRLC), and has been an outspoken pro-life leader in the public square... His election to head the USCCB's pro-life efforts speaks to the importance the bishops place on keeping the life issues at the forefront of our national dialogue. There is no doubt in my mind that Archbishop Naumann will serve as a tremendous and powerful voice on behalf of the unborn and their mothers. the elderly, and the medically dependent disabled,...Over the years, Archbishop Naumann has been a featured speaker at the National Right to Life Committee's annual convention, and will do so again this coming summer when Kansans for Life hosts NRLC's firstever national convention in Kansas (National Right to Life News, 11.15.17; archkck.org;americanheritagegirls.org; Wikipedia, "Joseph Fred Naumann").
