**Respect Life News:** Bishop Michel Aupetit of the diocese of Nanterre, France, was installed as archbishop of Paris on January 6. He succeeds retiring Cardinal Andre Vingt-trois. Archbishop Aupetit 66, a former medical doctor, has been described as a “vigorous pro-life advocate.” The archbishop’s vocation to the priesthood was a late one. He was ordained at age 44 after practicing medicine from 1979 to 1990. He also taught bioethics from 1997 to 2006 at the Henri-Mondor hospital center affiliated with the university of Paris at Creteil. Among his publications are *Contraception: la réponse de l'Église* (Contraception: The Response of the Church) 1999. In 2008, he published *L'Embryon, Quels Enjeux?* (The Embryo: What Are the Stakes?), a vigorous defense of the unborn child. He explains in this book: “We have tried to visit the different domains that concern the debate [over the unborn child]: biology, philosophy, history, law and anthropology, attempting to show that this is a subject of major importance for the future of man and of human civilization.” He addresses the pertinent issues in-depth, refuting objections, and pulling no punches when it comes to discussing where current trends are leading. Discussing embryo experimentation, for example, Archbishop Aupetit observes that pagans in the ancient world literally sacrificed their children on the altars of deities they thought would repay them with benefits like good crops, while today “the living human embryo is sacrificed on the altar of money.” Antiquity had its idols like Baal, but today’s “idols have changed their form: less coarse than in the past, they are called ‘money,’ ‘economic growth,’ ‘vanity,’ ‘celebrity,’ or ‘public renown.’ The victims? They are always the same.” In sum, the archbishop as a medical doctor, has the scientific background and expertise necessary to engage and respond to bioethicists and others ready to bless the next case of embryo experimentation here or euthanasia there. He is eminently qualified to proclaim and defend the Gospel of Life. (National Catholic Register, 1.6.18; internet search, passim).
