RESPECT LIFE NEWS


Proponents of assisted suicide (AS) continue their relentless drive to legalize physician assisted suicide in all 50 States of the Union. Sadly, they succeeded recently in New Jersey and Maine. Similar AS laws have been enacted in California, Oregon, Colorado, Hawaii, Vermont, Washington and the District of Columbia. Montana permits the practice as a result of a court ruling. Eighteen "other states considered such bills in the 2019 legislative season: Arizona, Arkansas, Connecticut, **Delaware**, Indiana, Kansas, Iowa, **Maryland**, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Nevada, New York, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Utah and **Virginia**."

New Jersey's law, euphemistically named "Medical Aid In dying for the Terminally III" was scheduled to go into effect on August first, but a New Jersey court issued a restraining order on the law. The state has until September 13th to respond to the order. Governor Phil Murphy (D) had signed the bill into law in April. Bishop James E. Checchio of Metuchen, New Jersey, condemned the law in a July 30th letter, describing it as "a grievous affront to the dignity of human life" that "can never be morally justified....Passage of this law points to the utter failure of government, and indeed all society, to care truly, authentically and humanely for the suffering and vulnerable in our midst, especially those living with an incurable disease as well as the frail elderly, the infirm and those living with disabilities.

Maine's law called "Death with Dignity," narrowly passed by the state's legislature on June 11 was signed by Governor Janet Mills (D) the next day. A window for repeal, however, Is open. The Christian Civic League of Maine on June 26 filed a petition to repeal the new law through a people's veto ballot initiative. Bishop Robert P. Deeley of Portland, Maine condemning the Maine law, said in part: "The passage of physician-assisted suicide...legalizes a practice which has devastating effects on the common good.... Allowing doctors to prescribe deadly medications to hasten a person's death is a horrendous wound to the dignity of the human person. With this law...there will be a further desensitization of the value of human life....This law devalues... the essential human bonds that call us to value one another and care for one another.... Let us all pray for an increase in the understanding and respect for the value and dignity of human life from conception to natural death."

In Washington, D.C., the August 4th *Washington Post*, p.C5, reported that in 2018: "At least two terminally ill DC residents ended their lives last year under a medical aid-in-dying law, according to city statistics released." From a pro-life perspective, we would report: "*Only* two 'people availed themselves of this misguided and dangerous law.' Four D.C. hospitals 'allow doctors to prescribe fatal doses of medication.'"


