### **ACT NOW: OCTOBER IS RESPECT LIFE MONTH —** OPPOSE BILL DECRIMINALIZING PROSTITUTION

A bill decriminalizing prostitution in the District has been introduced by D.C. Council members David Grosso (I-at large) and Robert C, White, Jr. (D-at large). It has been cosponsored by Brianne Nadeau (D=Ward 1) and Anita Bonds (D-at large). It is called the "Reducing Criminalization of Commercial Sex Amendment Act of 2019."

Please consider contacting Council members to ask them to oppose this bill. The Council's Judiciary Committee will hold hearings on it this fall. That Committee's chairman is Charles Allen (D-Ward 6); callen@dccouncil.us; (202) 724-8072. The other members are Anita

For an excellent critique of the bill, see Colbert King's Aug. 31 Washington Post op-ed article "The problem with decriminalizing prostitution in D.C." (washingtonpost.com/opinions/dcs-bill-to-decriminalize-prostitution). In it, King quotes from an interview he had with Vednita Carter, a prostitution survivor, and founder of a group that helps people escape prostitution. Carter describes it as "sexual exploitation" and "sexual abuse at its worst." King ends his article predicting the bill will pass "unless District voters make it clear" they oppose it.

The Washington Post also opposes the bill (Sept. 4, p. A 16). Mary Che opposes it as well, and has "moved legislation to eliminate criminal charges against minors forced into prostitution and substitutes social services because they are victims, not criminals." The Post however, reported on September 17 that the "controversial bill to legalize prostitution is gaining steam in Washington" (p. B5).

The Parish Council meets on nearly a bimonthly basis to support Msgr. Watkins in his pastoral work and provide a forum to discuss and review matters of importance to St. Ann's Parish.

#### MATTERS DISCUSSED AT THE SEPTEMBER 12 PARISH COUNCIL MEETING:

- The Council reviewed 150th Anniversary celebration activities, including upcoming organ concerts (October 1 and November 17) and plans for the May 16, 2020 Dinner/Dance Gala. Msgr. reminded the Council that there would be a new time capsule placed in the church and invited the Council members and parishioners to recommend items appropriate to include, such as copies of homilies, photos, musical recordings, programs and bulletins. The Council also discussed proposals to offer commemorative rosaries in commemoration of St. Ann's celebration.
- **Speaker events** will continue in 2020, and the Council was generally supportive of scheduling more speakers and events in 2020 and 2021 to continue the program beyond the 150th commemoration.
- The 150th Celebration Mass and reception on October 20 were discussed. Msgr. noted **Archbishop Gregory** will be celebrating, and that many **former St. Ann's clergy will attend**. Msgr. informed the Council that **food donations** (to be dropped off for the Mother Butler Guild) were **encouraged**.
- Monsignor informed the Council that the Society of St. John (SJS) has proposed a new 8:00am Saturday Mass (in addition to the current 5:00pm Vigil Mass). The Council expressed support for this; SJS clergy would lead the Masses, and Monsignor also noted the SJS support for the Wednesday and Friday 12:00pm Masses. Msgr. also noted that Eucharistic Adoration will begin to be offered on the 1st Friday of the month and continue on First Wednesdays with Saint John Society support.
- Spiritual life and activities: The Council was informed about a new outreach program at St. Ann's, called Alpha, to begin in January March of 2020, and help encourage friends and others who are generally not affiliated with Christian churches to join, through social gatherings, in regular discussions of faith, the meaning of Catholicism and other growth activity. The Walking With Purpose women's bible study program will resume October 2, and the Council was told the Parish would like for male leadership to step up to establish a similar program for men called That Man is You. In addition, Youth Director Natalie Plumb described plans to enhance parishioners' connection to the broader St. Ann Parish Community, such as a Speaker Series for parents during the hour Parish School of Religion classes are held. This speakers series would be hosted on the same days as the evening Youth Group program.
- The Council received a **report on the plans for the Boy Scouts** (Troop 100), its new leadership and plans to **start a Cub Scout program**.
- The Council provided **positive feedback on the new Bulletin**, and also heard of plans for a possible parish 150th video, to include video from the upcoming 10/20 celebratory Mass reception.

The Council set Thursday, November 7, 2019, at 7:00pm for its next meeting. All are welcome!
