
COVID UPDATE:

GOD'S DREAM FOR YOU

From December 8, 2020 to December 8, 2021, the Church is celebrating a year dedicated to St Joseph, husband to Mary and foster-father to Jesus. During this year, Pope Francis has encouraged us to learn more about St. Joseph and how he loved and cared for Mary and Jesus. Because there are no recorded words of St. Joseph, we learn about him by reading Scripture.

Read Matthew – 1:18-25 to learn about an important moment in St Joseph's life.

Did you notice that as soon as he woke up, Joseph did as the angel had prompted and took Mary as his wife, even though he had just learned she was pregnant and he was not the father? Joseph heard the angel's words as a call from God for his life. This call to be a husband and father became his vocation.

Joseph received the call to his vocation in a dream. God's call can come to us in different ways. As Pope Francis says – "[God] does not overwhelm us with dazzling visions but quietly speaks in the depths of our heart, drawing near to us and speaking to us through our thoughts and feelings." This means we need to keep our hearts always open to God's voice. Whenever we hear God's voice, we should respond like Joseph with a courageous 'yes!'

When we say 'yes' to God's call, we act like Joseph, and let God use us to bring about his saving work. Every vocation requires a commitment to serve others. When we say 'yes' to God, we offer Him our head so that God can shape our dreams, our hands to serve Him and neighbor, and our hearts to love Him faithfully.

There are several calls to vocation. Like Joseph and Mary, most people are called to the vocation of married life. However, some men are called to the vocation of the priesthood. Other women and men have a special vocation to religious life – living as religious sisters and brothers in service to others. Priests and religious commit themselves to love of God and neighbor by helping to bring the love of Christ to all. Faithfully answering God's call allows each of us to bring His love to the world in a particular way.
