Some highlights from our Fourth Annual St. Ann Flea Market:

We hosted it over two days, Saturday (9am to 5pm) and Sunday (9am to 3pm), with a 50% off sale on Sunday.

Donations included many treasures and nice items (Waterford, Tiffany, fine china, silver, and other). All high-end donations were sold.

We had an increase in attendance over last year, with a steady flow of shoppers throughout both days, which started with more than 100 people waiting in line before the doors opened on Saturday at 9!

We saw a mix of parishioners, other local Catholic church parishioners, community members, students, and others, many of whom thanked us for hosting the event and noting that they look forward to it and marked their calendars. Many came both days to take advantage of the discounts on Sunday. Many parishioners expressed gratitude for the opportunity to get involved.

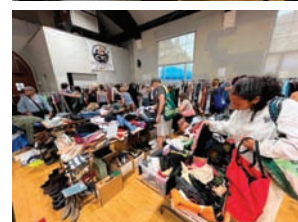
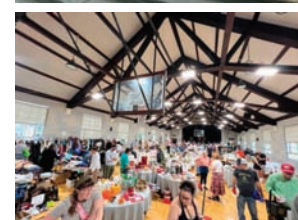
All leftover items were donated to Goodwill and select clothing (anything they wanted) to a community outreach group run by AU Law School students called Equal Justice Foundation.

We were able to raise more than \$15K through our sales. **Our exact total raised was \$15,175.20 This is a \$6K or 66% increase over last year's sales!**

This event could not have happened without all the support of our volunteers:

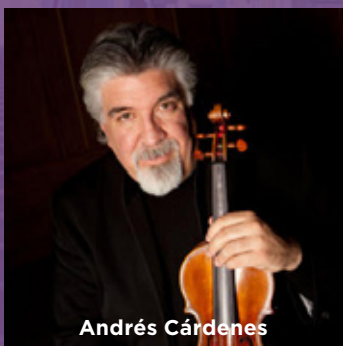

ANDRÉS CÁRDENES, Violinist

A fiery, dedicated and passionate violinist and conductor, Andrés Cárdenes taught music for 47 years, 35 of them at the Carnegie Mellon University School of Music. His distinguished career *par excellence* also includes an astonishing 21 years as the Concertmaster (the first chair of the first violin section) of the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra. He won the Second Prize in the prestigious Tchaikovsky International Violin Competition in Moscow in 1982, and then went on to solo on violin with over 100 orchestras all over the world, from St. Louis to Shanghai.

As a conductor, Cárdenes has led acclaimed performances with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, Colorado Symphony, Dallas Symphony Orchestra, Neue Philharmonie Westfalen, Orquesta Filarmónica de Bogotá, San Diego Symphony, Orquesta Sinfónica Municipal de Caracas and many more. He has made over 30 commercial recordings, has been nominated for the GRAMMY Award and has received humanitarian awards including the Kollel Foundation Jewish Learning Award, the Kindness Award from Chabad, Mexican Red Cross, WQED Musician of the Year and the UNICEF Cultural Ambassadorship.

His colleague Daniel Nesta Curtis, an Associate Teaching Professor, Director of the Contemporary Ensemble, and Resident Conductor since 2012, remarked, "It is impossible to overstate the profound influence Andrés Cárdenes has had on several generations of music students through his decades of teaching at the CMU School of Music. Andrés is a one-of-a-kind artist, a truly dedicated teacher, and I feel incredibly fortunate to call him a friend, colleague, and mentor. No one has done more than Andrés to make the CMU School of Music the vibrant, creative, excellent place that it is today."

MARTIN LABAZEVTCH, Pianist

Praised by critics in Europe and the United States for his lyricism, virtuosity and an intensity of performance, pianist Martin Labazevitch appeared in many concert halls and festivals in Poland, Ukraine, Finland, Germany, Austria, Italy, Spain, Israel, Japan, South Korea and the United States. Born in Poland, Mr. Labazevitch studied at the Odessa Conservatory in Ukraine and at

the Manhattan School of Music in New York. In 2019 he received the Doctor of Musical Arts degree at the Rome School of Music, Drama and Art in Washington D.C.

He has been a soloist with leading orchestras in Spain, Poland, Lithuania, Japan, and the United States. Of his debut album release of the Chopin Concerto with the Beethoven Academy Orchestra, ConcertoNet wrote, "...he pleasantly refrains from overtaxing Chopin's conclusive Allegro vivace with shimmering grandeur and eloquent precision that could even rival that of Arthur Rubinstein."

An enthusiastic educator, Mr. Labazevitch has been sharing his passion for teaching with students at the Levine School of Music in Washington D.C. He is also the Co-Founder of the Puerto Rico International Piano Festival, in San Juan as well as the Artistic Director of the Kosciuszko Foundation Chopin Piano Competition and Chopin Piano Academy in Washington D.C. In 2022 Mr. Labazevitch co-founded The Paderewski Academy, a pioneer hybrid piano academy based in Zurich, Switzerland.

Mr. Labazevitch is a Steinway Artist.
