

Cover: Giotto di Bondone Nativity: Birth of Christ (cappella Scrovegni, arena Chapel, Padua)
Born around the year 1266, in Vespignano near Florence and died January 8, 1337 in Florence,
Giotto di Bondone is considered the most important Italian painter of the 14th century, whose
works point to the innovations of the Renaissance style that developed a century later. For almost
seven centuries, Giotto has been revered as the father of European painting and the first of the
great Italian masters. He is believed to have been a pupil of the Florentine painter, Cimabue, and to
have decorated chapels in Assisi, Rome, Padua, Florence, and Naples with frescoes and panel
paintings in tempera. Because little of his life and few of his works are documented, attributions
and a stylistic chronology of his paintings remain problematic and often highly speculative.


