

### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners,

To continue from last week: what God does for us at the Holy Mass (and in all the sacraments) is something we cannot do for ourselves. Of course what God does is done for us, and yet we must remember that it is not done without us, that is, without our participation and cooperation. This is why what we do at Mass is not unimportant. In fact, all that we do should become a help to the opening of our minds, hearts and souls to the action of God. This is part of the reason why the liturgy of the Church, especially the Mass, demands our very best. It demands the very best in what we do and in what we provide for the celebration of the sacraments. In the liturgy we are able to offer God our worship, our sacrifices, indeed our very self and we are able to do this, not of our own initiative but because of the Lord's grace through the activity of the Holy Spirit. The liturgy then grants us a closeness, an intimacy with God. This intimacy makes the liturgy truly sacred and bestows upon it a great dignity and majesty that calls for the very best of us, it calls for us to put forth the highest quality we can possibly provide, for we should want to give nothing less than that to God. So take for example the altar furnishing and the priestly vestments. They should be the best we can provide. This does not mean they should be a wasteful extravagance, but rather they should have a noble dignity and not be commonplace. These things are not for the enjoyment of the priest either, but should express our reverence and regard for the true nature of the liturgy of the Lord's Church. So if what we provide as a community calls for our very best, this is also true for each of us as individuals. Each one of us ought to sing our very best, respond and pray and even dress our very best. None of this should distract us from the action of God, nor ever be the sole or central focus of our attention. All of this, all that we do and all we provide for the sacred liturgy, should lead us to a greater awareness of the Lord's presence and activity in the celebration of the Holy Mass. We will continue our reflections on the sacred liturgy in two weeks after Christmas and the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. Until then, enjoy the celebration of those Holy Days. Peace—Father Adam
