

EUCHARIST

WEEKEND LITURGIES:

Every first Friday; other times upon request

FIRST EUCHARIST:

Usually celebrated in 2nd grade for children. Celebrated at the Easter Vigil for adults.

BAPTISM

Baptisms for registered parishioners are celebrated at 1:15 p.m. on Sundays: monthly during the summer, and twice a month during the rest of the year. A required orientation for first-time parents of babies being baptized is held one Sunday each month, 10:15—11:45 a.m. (July & August by appointment.) Please contact the parish office in advance to register for the orientation and to schedule the Baptism. No Baptisms are scheduled until after the baby has been born.

Adults: participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). Through this process, the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation are received. For further information, contact the parish office.

CONFIRMATION

Parishioners of high school age are confirmed following a two-year preparation program, usually culminating with Confirmation in the beginning of junior year. Adult parishioners are usually confirmed at the Easter Vigil. For further information, contact the parish office.

PENANCE

For all parishioners: celebrated on Saturday from 4:15-4:45 p.m. in the Atrium Conference Room; outside of these times, upon request. Communal Penance services are held in Advent and Lent. First Penance: Usually celebrated in the 2st grade.

MARRIAGE

Please contact the parish office one year prior to the wedding. Preparation for Marriage includes: Pre-Cana or Marriage Encounter, as well as meetings with the priest who will witness the Marriage. Weddings may be scheduled any day Monday through Saturday. No weddings will be scheduled on Sundays, eves of holidays, holidays, or holiday weekends.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

This sacrament may be celebrated with any person who is seriously ill. A communal celebration of this sacrament is held periodically. You may request this sacrament at any time, especially in case of emergency. Any parishioner who is in the hospital and wishes to see a member of the parish staff should notify the parish office.



U.S. SISTERS AGAINST TRAFFICKING

On the forefront of awareness and action against human trafficking is Sr. Gabriella Bottani, coordinator of Talitha Kum, and head of the committee organizing the World Day of Prayer and Awareness Agaist Human Trafficking.

Sr. Gabriella tells us that the <u>World Day of Prayer</u> began because of the inspiration of the life of St Josephine Bakhita, herself a slave, who was canonized in 2007. St. Josephine's experience caused "some religious women—Italian religious women—to ask Pope Francis to have this international day of prayer for the whole Church." As a result, Pope Francis entrusted this task in 2014 to the Unions of Superiors General asking them to promote this day.

The theme for the 2018 World Day of prayer is "Migration without trafficking. Say yes to Freedom and No to slavery." Sr. Gabriella tells us that according to statistics released last year by the International Organization for Migration "around 75% of the people that were crossing the Mediterranean Sea (...) said and declared to have experienced trafficking.

"The voice of Pope Francis is a prophetic voice supporting the whole Church, and all people of good will working in this field." She sees his influence in the increased commitment on the part of Catholic organizations, and the support of Bishops Conferences which is growing. The participation of the Holy See in the United Nation's sponsored global compact for migration, she says, is also very important. Her hope is that "they will be able also to promote a good international policy to protect migrants against trafficking."

The contribution of women religious in the work against human trafficking is fundamental because there are 22 networks in 76 countries "and sisters are really very active in prevention and assisting victims." They live among the people and can access remote areas where people are recruited by traffickers that makes their presence in this effort so valuable. "The trust relationship that sisters have worldwide are very important also. The sisters are close with families, and are also able to alert local authorities when a student has stopped going to school. "In many cases we... give the right information to allow the governmental organization to rescue these people from trafficking." She also tells us of a new initiative of women religious working with Talitha Kum in Thailand. "They started a very interesting work with Buddhist nuns.... The religious sisters will train the Buddhist nuns, and the Buddhist nuns will get involved with us in anti-trafficking.'

REFLECTION BY REV. LEONARD N. PETERSON...

The moon and stars align this year to place Easter on the same day as the secular world calls "April Fools' Day." It is not intentional on anyone's part to be disrespectful of this greatest of all Christian feasts. In this context it would be unjust and uncharitable to assert that anyone who denies that Jesus rose from the dead is simply a fool. When all is said and done, to believe that He did rise is a gift in itself. That gift we call "Faith." Plainly speaking, one either has the gift or does not. The reason for this is one of those perplexing facts that God does not bestow His gifts according to any rationale of ours. He has His reasons. As Cardinal Newman observed, "He is most sure in all His ways."

Then again, for those who simply doubt that Jesus rose, one can only hope and pray that someday their minds will be convinced and their hearts will follow in order to usher in a peace they deserve.

But for those of us who do believe, this Easter day is the "day of days." Its juxtaposition with April Fools' Day can serve as a reminder of how foolish we become whenever we forget the facts of the gospel, and live as if they were fiction.

If Christ is risen, then He is truly God. And if He is God, then everything He said or did represent not only human nature at its best, but also the divine nature as loving us beyond imagination. In fact, He endured Good Friday just for you and me. Truly astounding! That we would ever choose to sin against Him is foolish in the extreme. Truly despicable!

But to believe that our poor expressions of contrition restore His love is humbling beyond words. Truly incredible! Indeed, "This is the day the Lord has made. Let us rejoice in it!"

Here is a touching Easter poem by Cecil Frances Alexander (1818-1895) entitled "There is a Green Hill Far Away."

"There is a green hill far away, Beyond the city wall, Where the dear Lord was crucified, Who died to save us all.

We may not know, we cannot tell, What pains he had to bear; We believe it was for us, He hung and suffered there.

He died that we might be forgiven; He died to make us good, That we might go to heaven, Saved by His precious blood.

There was no other good enough To pay the price of sin, He only could unlock the gate, Of heaven and let us in.

O dearly, dearly, He has loved, We must love Him too, Trust in His redeeming blood, And try His works to do."

This is the day

Easter isn't a footrace, as the first disciples demonstrate. It doesn't matter when you come to faith, whether you were baptized as an infant or just last night. You don't win points for what you understand at the mouth of the empty tomb, whether you've studied 20 centuries of dogma about it or just rely on a gut feeling that this event changes everything. Mary Magdalene, Peter, and the beloved disciple each perceive the tomb and its significance from different angles—yet they all spend their lives as witnesses. Go and live like Easter makes a difference!

Time stands still

A young monk chided his novice master for having prayed at the Easter Monday Mass, "On this Easter day . . ." "Certainly, you should have sung 'in this Easter season,' " the novice explained. "After all, Easter is over." The wise older priest pointed out—much more gently than deserved—that Easter Day itself lasts eight days, a full week, and only then do we move into the Easter season. Like the obliteration of the reign of death that Easter is, time itself is set on its head. Like the wedding day that, in many cultures, is simply too overflowing with joy to be contained in a single 24 hours, the spirit of hope that is Easter will not be confined. May it rise in your heart this Easter Day!

Sometimes you have to do what's right even in the face of opposition. On the other hand, when Mary Magadalene came to some of these same disciples with news of the risen Jesus, they did not believe her. Of course it's unwise to always reject what others think of you. But when faced with a difficult situation, ask God for the wisdom and the strength to do what is right and good.
