SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

To Everyone at CC:

This past week, I am sure you saw the many reports in the media concerning the action of all the dioceses of our state in publishing the names of priests and deacons who were credibly accused of the sexual abuse of minors in the entire history of each diocese. This is my first time as pastor here to have to address these terrible things. So you know clearly where I stand: these actions where minors were abused are wrong. They hurt all of us and are so damaging to the faith of many people.

There is one important fact that I hope you can appreciate in the midst of all the media attention. As awful as these things were in our history, you need to know that there has been great progress made in addressing these issues. Looking backwards, we can see that things have improved, thank goodness. Honesty demands that we acknowledge that the evil of the sexual abuse of minors has affected many institutions in our society that served children, not only the Catholic Church. In our diocese, we have seen hopeful progress.

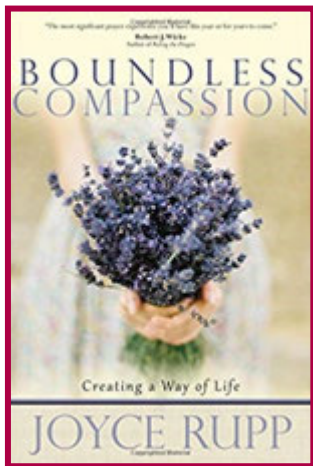
Please consider this most important fact that was mentioned in the diocesan release from Bishop Serratelli:

"Since the Dallas Charter in 2002, three priests from our diocese have been credibly accused of sexually abusing minors. Prior to the Dallas Charter, in the period between the founding of our diocese in 1937 and up to the time of the adoption of the Dallas Charter in 2002, another twenty four priests and one deacon had been credibly accused of the sexual abuse of minors. One case of a child being abused is one too many. In the name of the Church, I am profoundly sorry that even one priest or minister abused one minor. I apologize to every single victim. We must remain vigilant. We can never be complacent."

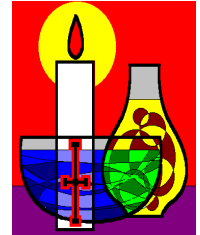

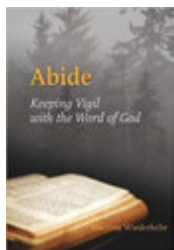
Gospel of John

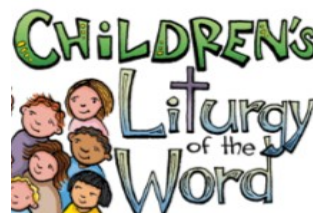

The Dark Story Behind The Super Bowl Most Sports Fans Ignore

Bars of soap in hotel rooms might save lives this Super Bowl weekend. As the eyes of the world watch the action unfolding at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta, police, authorities, airlines and hotels are dealing with a sinister problem that tends to arise this time of year: human trafficking activity.

While antislavery groups are cautious to paint Super Bowl as a magnet for sex trafficking — they're quick to point out it's a year-round problem — the NFL championship match is often been dubbed the biggest sex trafficking event in the United States, as hundreds of thousands of cashed-up sports fans descend on the host city to celebrate the big game and, in many cases, indulge in sex services that use Super Bowl as their hook.

What's worse is this year's host city, Atlanta, is considered one of the biggest hubs of sex trafficking nationwide, according to WTOL News.

Anti-human trafficking groups and authorities have stepped up their efforts to bust sex rings and rescue victims. Posters have been plastered around the city bearing the faces of 16 missing girls feared to be victims of human trafficking.

Atlanta police officers have been given two hours of extra training on how to recognize and deal with human trafficking in the lead-up to Super Bowl weekend, a police spokesman told Reuters.

Police in Georgia have already arrested at least 40 people in relation to sex trafficking over the weekend, and rescued four victims.

And hotel staff and flight attendants — often regarded as the frontline defense against human trafficking — are stepping up their efforts to identify victims.

And this year, hotels have seen an unusual but hopefully effective approach.

Massive deliveries of bars of soap and makeup wipes were dropped off at hotels around Atlanta last weekend bearing a message to potential victims and a phone number to get help.

Adults: participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). Through this process, the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation are received. For further information, contact the parish office.

CONFIRMATION

Parishioners of high school age are confirmed following a two-year preparation program, usually culminating with Confirmation in the beginning of junior year. Adult parishioners are usually confirmed at the Easter Vigil. For further information, contact the parish office.

PENANCE

For all parishioners: celebrated on Saturday from 4:15-4:45 p.m. in the Atrium Conference Room; outside of these times, upon request.

Communal Penance services are held in Advent and Lent.

First Penance: Usually celebrated in the 2nd grade.

MARRIAGE

Please contact the parish office one year prior to the wedding. Preparation for Marriage includes: Pre-Cana or Engaged Encounter, as well as meetings with the Pastoral Associate for Marriage and Family, the Music Minister, and the Priest who will witness the marriage. Weddings may be scheduled any day Monday through Saturday. No weddings will be scheduled on Sundays, eves of holidays, holidays, or holiday weekends.

ANointing OF THE SICK

This sacrament may be celebrated with any person who is seriously ill. A communal celebration of this sacrament is held periodically. You may request this sacrament at any time, especially in case of emergency. Any parishioner who is in the hospital and wishes to see a member of the parish staff should notify the parish office.
