CORPUS CHRISTI CONTINUES TO BE ENERGY EFFICIENT!

Beginning either the week of June 17th or June 24th Corpus Christi will be donning a new High Efficiency HVAC system for the Atrium Area. The old unit was 30 years old.

As the replacement happens, the entrance to Corpus Christi will be closed for half a day. We ask that you proceed with caution if coming to Church as the exit will be both an entrance and exit. Follow the road rules of a two-way street.

The total cost of this project is \$57,000 which Corpus Christi will pay \$17,000. This was funded under a state program called *Direct Install* under New Jersey Clean Energy which is paying approximately 70% of the cost. In addition to the HVAC system, Corpus Christi has looked to further increase its energy efficiency by installing LED Lighting throughout the building.

The energy savings from both the HVAC unit and the LED Lighting will pay for the \$17,000 expenditure in just three years. To read more about this state program please follow the link below:

You are invited to come and spend a few minutes or the whole hour in adoration before Jesus in the Eucharist on this special Feast Day!




NUNS HEALING HEARTS CAMPAIGN

Are Migrant Children Welcomed in Jesus' Name?

Human Trafficking have an excellent educational resource, "Intersectionality of Human Trafficking with Migrants, Refugees, and Internally Displaced People."

Mark 10:13-16: People were bringing little children to Jesus, for him to touch them. The disciples scolded them, but when Jesus saw this he was indignant and said to them "Let the little children come to me, do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs." Additionally, Jesus said, "Anyone who welcomes such a little child such as this in my name welcomes me..." (Mark 9:37)

Migrant children arriving at the U.S. southern border are not welcome. How would Jesus respond to how these children and their families are treated? What is your response? What does Jose's story call you, challenge you to do?"

This is a typical story of a young migrant boy, a child. "My name is Jose and I am 12 years old. I left Honduras with my mother, two sisters, and Miguel, my uncle. We do not know where my father is. Our goal was to travel in a larger group, eventually arriving at the United States border. We hoped to cross over to a new and better life. We hoped to feel safe, find shelter and have food to eat. We were escaping from violence and poverty, at home we had nothing—barely enough to eat and we never felt safe.

We traveled for many days and struggled to find food, water and a place to stay. My little sisters cried a lot because they were tired, hungry and scared. I tried to be strong and to help my uncle. My mother cried when we weren't watching. She didn't know I saw her.

Finally, we arrived at the border, but it wasn't at all like we expected. There were hundreds of people jammed in small spaces, on bridges, under bridges. The armed men (like ones we left behind in Honduras) separated us. My little sisters stayed with my mother and the men took my uncle and me to a detention center. We had food and water, but they took our shoelaces away from us. Pretty soon, we were separated and they took me to another part where there were hundreds of boys like me. I was cold and scared. After a few weeks, they took about 25 of us away in a van.

They drove to someplace far away. And when we got there it was hot and sunny—like at home in Honduras. We were forced to work long hours in fields without shade picking strawberries. Where we slept and what they gave us to eat was awful. We also didn't get much water while we worked.

When there weren't any more strawberries to pick, we were packed in a van, but it was stopped by the police. When they found all of us inside, they arrested those taking us. We were taken to another shelter. I don't know what comes next, but I hope I get to be back with my family—wherever they are now." Intersectionality of Human Trafficking: https://

Truth is what reveals reality

A powerful politician once asked a condemned man: "What is truth?" If Pilate had sought truth, he'd have recognized his prisoner and set Jesus—and himself—free. Dostoevsky warned what happens to those who lose contact with the truth: They "lose all respect for themselves and for others. And having no respect, they cease to love." It's easy for Pilate to condemn a man who doesn't matter. Choose respect, choose love, and everyone begins to matter.

TODAY'S READINGS: Proverbs 8:22-31; Romans 5:1-5; John 16:12-15 (166). "But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth."

Wage peace

Jesus' call to nonviolence is often misinterpreted as passivity and weakness. Far from it! In the words of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, nonviolence does not mean surrendering to evil, but actively and courageously responding to it with good, "and thus breaking the chain of injustice." It means being someone "who is convinced of God's love and power, who is not afraid to confront evil with the weapons of love and truth alone." Join what the Holy Father called the "Christian revolution" of loving your enemy and start waging peace.

It rains on everybody

God does not withhold divine blessings from bad people and give them to good people, though you'd have a hard time getting some folks to believe that. Perfect human justice is merely even-steven. Divine justice, bounded by mercy, goes way beyond just deserts.

Get some expert advice

Saint Romuald lived from the first millennium into the second. He likewise bridged the world of monastic prayer and the rest of the world by showing that ordinary experiences are examples of how to relate to God. He said, for example, "Sit in your cell as in paradise. Put the whole world behind you and forget it"—perhaps anticipating today's "turn off your cell phone and television." He said, "Watch your thoughts like a good fisherman watching for fish," suggesting that if you know how to fish—be silent, still, and wait for the fish to make themselves known—then you know how

to pray. A great saint can point us to holiness in simple, commonplace ways.

While studying theology in Rome when a plague broke out, he volunteered to care for the sick in a Jesuit hospital. That sacrifice eventually claimed his life at the tender age of 23. Give thanks for the friends who stand by you and renew you in times of joy and of struggle—the real treasure in your life.

On the scaffold More described himself as the "king's good servant—but God's first." The film version of More's life, *A Man for All Seasons*, won six Oscars, including Best Picture. EUCHARIST

WEEKEND LITURGIES:

Saturday—5 p.m. Sunday—7:30 a.m., 9:30 a.m., 11:30 a.m.

EUCHARIST FOR THE SICK & HOMEBOUND:

Every First Friday; other times upon request

FIRST EUCHARIST:

Usually celebrated in 2nd grade for children. Celebrated at the Easter Vigil for adults.

BAPTISM

Infant baptism: for registered parishioners are celebrated two Sundays a month. A 1-hour baptism preparation class is required for all first-time parents. After the child is born, contact the parish office to schedule the baptism. Baptism prep classes are scheduled as needed.

Adults: participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). Through this process, the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation are received. For further information, contact the parish office.

CONFIRMATION

Parishioners of high school age are confirmed following a twoyear preparation program, usually culminating with Confirmation in the beginning of junior year. Adult parishioners are usually confirmed at the Easter Vigil. For further information, contact the parish office.

CONFESSION TIMES

Saturday from 4:00 to 4:45 p.m. in the Atrium Conference Room; (and by appointment with one of our priests) Communal Penance services are held in Advent and Lent. First Penance: Usually celebrated in the 2nd grade.

MARRIAGE

Please contact the parish office one year prior to the wedding. Preparation for Marriage includes: Pre-Cana or Engaged Encounter, as well as meetings with the Pastoral Associate for Marriage and Family, the Music Minister, and the Priest who will witness the marriage. Weddings may be scheduled any day Monday through Saturday. No weddings will be scheduled on Sundays, eves of holidays, holidays, or holiday weekends.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

This sacrament may be celebrated with any person who is seriously ill. A communal celebration of this sacrament is held periodically. You may request this sacrament at any time, especially in case of emergency. Any parishioner who is in the hospital and wishes to see a member of the parish staff should notify the parish office.
