June 14, 2020 The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

THE FEAST OF "CORPUS CHRISTI": THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

In 1263 a German priest, Fr. Peter of Prague, made a pilgrimage to Rome. He stopped in Bolsena, Italy, to celebrate Mass at the Church of St. Christina. At the time, he was having doubts about Jesus being truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. When he recited the prayer of Consecration at Mass, blood started to seep from the consecrated host and onto the cloth corporal.

Fr. Peter reported this miracle to Pope Urban IV, who sent delegates to investigate. The host and the blood-stained corporal were then placed in the Cathedral of Orvieto, Italy, where they remain today.

This Eucharistic Miracle confirmed the visions given to St. Juliana of Mont Cornillon in Belgium (1193-1258). St. Juliana was a nun and mystic who had a series of visions in which she was instructed by Our Lord to work to establish a liturgical feast for the Holy Eucharist. For many years, she had tried to convince the bishop, the future Pope Urban IV, to create this special feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament.

Soon after the miracle of Bolsena, Pope Urban IV commissioned St. Thomas Aquinas to compose the Proper for a Mass and an Office for the Feast day. One year later, in August of 1264, Pope Urban IV, by means of the papal Bull, *Transiturus*, instituted the Feast of *Corpus Christi* for the universal Church.



The Eucharist is God's perfect gift to us. It provides the spiritual healing and strength that we need each week to follow Jesus as a disciple. But in a deeper way, the Eucharist is the supernatural food that draws us into the very life of the Trinity! How awesome!

On this our patronal feast day, let us thank God for loving us enough to be present with us throughout our lives in the gift of the Eucharist!

Please keep in mind that Bishop Serratelli has granted a dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday/Holy Day of Obligation Masses for the time being. This means that you are not required to come to in-person Masses at this time. For those who remain at home, our live stream Mass will continue on Saturday at 5:00 PM and Sunday at 9:00 AM and 11:00 AM.

I thank our parish volunteers and staff who have been working very hard to establish a plan that does everything we reasonably can to make this a safe re-opening for those who are able to attend.

This is the next step our parish is taking to bring us back to worshiping together in-person fully with an unrestricted celebration of the sacraments.

MASKS and SANITIZERS

- We will have Mass in the Parish Hall because it is easier to clean and sanitize after each Mass. Also, it will require fewer volunteers to ensure social distancing.
- For those over two years old, masks should be worn as soon as you arrive, during Mass and until you return to your vehicle.
- Parishioners are encouraged to bring their own hand sanitizer. The Parish Hall will be cleaned and sanitized after every Mass.

PARKING

• Please park in the <u>rear church parking lot</u>. You will enter through the doors near the Parish Hall. No other doors will be open.

There will be handicap parking spots available in the rear parking lot clearly marked.

SEATING CAPACITY

- Weekend Masses will be limited to 50 seats at each Mass. <u>Pre-registration online is</u> required. See above links for mass reservations. We will be opening reservations for weekend masses each Wednesday before noon for signups. Since there are a limited number of tickets available for each Mass, please be considerate and let others have an opportunity to come.
- Seating will begin 20 minutes before the start of Mass. Please arrive early
- Seating can be customized based on your reservation to ensure your health and safety. Family members of the same household will sit together. Everyone else will be seated six feet apart to comply with social distancing.

Additional masses will be added on the weekends according to the need

ENTRANCE

- While observing proper social distancing, please stand in a line while awaiting entry. A greeter will meet you at the entrance and check you in before you enter the Parish Hall. Please have your confirmation email (print or phone) ready to view
- Once you enter the Parish Hall, please sanitize your hands.
 An usher will then guide you to your seat.

COMMUNION

- Communion will be distributed at the end of Mass in the rear of the Parish Hall. <u>After the final blessing, remain in your seat until you are guided to a Communion Station</u>. This will begin from the last row. If you prefer not to receive Communion, please follow the Communion procession and receive a blessing by crossing your arms.
- Our Bishop has asked that communion not be offered on the tongue, but only be received in the hand.
- No gloves should be worn while receiving communion.
- Use of personal hand sanitizer before communion is strongly encouraged.
- Please keep social distancing in Communion line
- Upon reaching the Communion Station, the communicant <u>should not</u> remove mask, receive the host in their hands first, begin to walk away, lower your mask, consume the Communion, and put mask back up.

Please then follow the directions of the ushers to exit the Parish Hall.

PLEASE NOTE

- There will be no bulletins or missals.
- At the Bishop's request singing by the congregation is discouraged. The ordinary parts of the Mass (*i.e. the Gloria, Sanctus, Lamb of God*) will be recited.

Donation baskets will not be passed during the Offertory. You will be able to place your weekly gift in a basket as you enter/exit the parish hall. We recommend that you consider modifying your giving and give online. See our website to donate electronically. It is an easy and safe way to make your recurring or one-time donation and at this time it helps us administratively.

- There will be no Sign of Peace.
- No food or drink will be permitted in church.
- The restrooms are available for emergency use only.
- No public gatherings or greetings are allowed before or after Mass. Please proceed directly to your car following Mass.

Together we can make our worship space a safe and comfortable environment for one another.

I know that this is a lot of information to digest. As we go through several Masses, we will refine our processes to make it easier on everyone. Please know that your safety is a priority for us!



REFLECTION ... BY REV. LEONARD N. PETERSON

There it sat, looking lonely among the taller offerings in the supermarket Easter flower section. A tricolor hyacinth in the colors of Lent and Easter: purple, pink, and white. I picked it up to grace the room where I pray. There I was delighted by the plant's unique fragrance. However it soon gave in to that habit of hyacinths to lean down one way or another. But what struck me this time was the fact that the plant seemed to lean toward the light coming from the window. It was yearning for the sun. Yearning for the sun. Think about that. All you have to do is change the lone vowel in "sun" from "u" to "o" and you have the lifelong motivation of a Christian: "Yearning for the Son." The Son of God, Our risen Lord Jesus Christ.

The wonderful truth that we can see and touch the very Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ in the Holy Eucharist fulfills that yearning. Some day, when we get to see the Lord face to face, yearning will evaporate. In the meantime we have this special feast of "Corpus Christi," the Body of Christ, to celebrate this greatest treasure of our Church.

The feast originated in 1246 when Robert de Torote, bishop of Liège, ordered the festival celebrated in his diocese. He was persuaded to initiate the feast by St. Juliana, prioress of Mont Cornillon near Liège, who had experienced a vision. It did not spread until 1261, when Jacques Pantaléon, formerly archdeacon of Liège, became pope as Urban IV. In 1264 he ordered the whole church to observe the feast. Urban's order was confirmed by Pope Clement V at the Council of Vienne in 1311–12. By the mid-14th century the festival was generally accepted, and in the 15th century it became, in effect, one of the principal feasts of the Church.

By its calendar placement, this feast gives us the occasion to ponder Christ's gift to us of Himself at the Last Supper. On Holy Thursday, the pending Passion of Our Lord's death hung in the air with sober sadness over that Upper Room. On that same evening, in this strange unforgettable year, we lived under the pressure of a mandate to stay home. A virus took away our physical participation. Our yearning for the Lord intensified, and we all felt it.

All of our great Church saints had exemplary faith in Christ's gift of Himself in this sacrament. They had the same yearning for the Son of God that we do. And like that little hyacinth plant leaning toward the light-filled window, we also lean toward the One Person who fills our hearts and souls with the Light of Hope. As an anonymous writer put it: "Hope sees the invisible, feels the intangible, and achieves the impossible."

SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRIST))

E pluribus unum

As the United States celebrates flag day, remember that when the Revolutionary War began, no "American" flag existed. Each regiment fought under its own banner. It was another two years before the Second Continental Congress determined that 13 stars and stripes would signify the union of the colonies. An everexpanding nation required more stars, and then more. It was wisely decided to leave the stripes alone. Holding 50 states together is a challenge in each generation. It takes even more will to hold together a church a billion strong, squatting under banners of preferred views and opinions. "One faith, one Lord, one Baptism" remains our call to unity.

TODAY'S READINGS: Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a; 1 Corinthians 10:16-17; John 6:51-58 (167). "The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ?"

Cheeky faith

There was a time when the rite of Confirmation included a tap on the cheek—symbolic of being struck—by the bishop, who at the same time wished you peace. The custom was knightly in origin. When you are confirmed, you become a "soldier of Christ," so you must be ready to risk danger for your faith. But the sacrament strengthens you for the spiritual battles of your lifetime, including for times of crisis. Turning the other cheek hardly means being passive in the face of trials, but rather never giving up in the struggle. Offer yourself over and over in the service of good.

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Kings 21:1-16; Matthew 5:38-42 (365). "Should anyone press you into service for one mile, go with him for two miles."

Tuesday, Jun 16, 2020

Perfectly clear

The phrase "biblical criticism" doesn't mean to criticize Sacred Scripture, though Pope Leo XIII seemed to think so when he wrote the 1893 encyclical *Providentissimus Deus*, which took a dim view of the practice. Rather, it refers to the use of scholarly disciplines—such as literature and history—to uncover the Bible's deeper meanings. Fortunately, 50 years later, Pope Pius XII penned *On the Most Opportune Way to Promote Biblical Studies* to encourage what had been discouraged. Thanks to it, we can delve into the word "perfect" in Matthew 5:48 and learn it's an imperfect translation of the Greek "*teleios*," which means to have integrity. May your actions match your words.

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Kings 21:17-29; Matthew 5:43-48 (366). "Be perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect."

Wednesday, Jun 17, 2020

Love leads the way

Doing good is not only what we are called to do as Christians, it is also a benefit to all human beings in the long run. Evolutionary studies show that cooperative behavior has long-term benefits for human beings; whereas selfish behavior is a short-term win. In these difficult days, let love be your guide, your inner voice, and your consolation. Doing good is indeed its own reward.

TODAY'S READINGS: 2 Kings 2:1, 6-14; Matthew 6:1-6, 16-18 (367). "Take care not to perform righteous deeds in order that people may see them."

Thursday, Jun 18, 2020

Lead on

A small change in translation can be a big deal when the words of the Lord's Prayer are at stake. After years of consideration, Italian and French bishops embraced a change in the version said at Mass, from "lead us not into temptation" to "do not let us fall into temptation." The change intends to clarify the fact that God doesn't lead people toward evil. So, if you are tempted toward sin today, why not ask God to lead you elsewhere?
