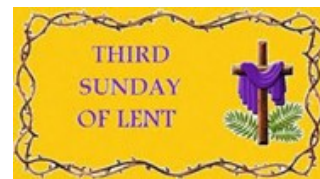

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

UKRAINE

Only 10 hours away by airplane, there are innocent people who are suffering in Ukraine. As I write this, I try to make sense of what is happening there. The Gospel this weekend can give us some insight.



Some people mention to Jesus the Galileans whose blood Pilate mingled with their sacrifices. Jesus asks: 'Do you think that these Galileans were worse sinners than all the other Galileans, because they suffered thus?' And then Jesus answers that they were not. These Galileans were innocent victims who suffered through the faults of others. There were also eighteen people on whom the tower in Siloam fell. We don't know why the tower fell. It seems that they were innocent victims who died through unfortunate circumstances. They happened to be in the wrong place at the wrong time.

These raise a difficult question: how can a loving God allow the innocent to suffer? Jesus reminds us that it is misguided to think that those who suffer in some way deserved this fate. Sometimes words can be cheap. Jesus responds not with words but with his life.

Jesus is on his way to Jerusalem to freely demonstrate the greatest act of love. He allows himself to be taken prisoner, to be stripped of all his possessions, to be humiliated, tortured, and to die in shame to remind us that there are innocent victims and that Jesus walks in solidarity with them.

Yet he also shows us another side. Cruelty and violence will not have the last word. God's love and power are greater than any injustice. Goodness will triumph over evil. With Jesus' death and resurrection, God can take the worst that life throws at us, even death, and transform them into something life-giving and meaningful.

It is in times like these, that we are called to turn to Christ in a deeper way as we try to make sense of what we see in the news. We pray for all those who are victims of injustice, and we do what we can to assist them. In the end, we find hope in the fact that our God has conquered sin and death and ultimately is in control. As we journey through Lent, when darkness can seem overwhelming, we can rest in the knowledge that God's light is greater than the darkness!

TENEBRAE SERVICE

The word Tenebrae is Latin for "shadows" or "darkness." The Tenebrae service is an ancient tradition in Christian history that took place on one of the last three days of Holy Week. The purpose was to remember the events that occurred in Jesus' life from the exuberant entrance into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday through the night of Jesus' burial on Good Friday. The flames of these candles are extinguished one by one as Scripture readings and hymns are shared to tell the story of Holy Week. This gradual darkness is a representation of Jesus' increasing sorrow as the events of Passion Week unfolded.

UPDATE: MOVING FOWARD

During the past six months, more in-person worship and social opportunities here at Corpus Christi have been available to our parishioners. It is wonderful to see that more members of our community are responding by participating in-person! Being together in-person is an important part of living out our faith. Based on this, we are making some adjustments in how we allocate our parish resources.

Beginning the weekend of March 5-6, we are adjusting our weekend online Mass schedule. For our parishioners who are unable to attend in-person, we will have two opportunities to view our parish weekend Masses. Beginning March 5-6, we will have a "simple" livestreaming of the Saturday night Masses at 5 pm. On Sundays, we will livestream only the 11 am Mass. Viewers will be able to watch either the 5 pm Saturday or 11 am Sunday Mass at any time that is convenient. In addition, we will continue to livestream our daily Masses, Monday to Friday, at 7:30 am. We want to ensure that everyone in the Corpus Christi community has the opportunity to be with us in spirit and look forward to welcoming them back in person when they are able to attend.

GUIDELINES FOR FASTING AND ABSTINENCE DURING LENT

Roman Catholics are asked to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday and on all Fridays during Lent. The rule of abstinence from meat is for Catholics age 14 and onwards, unless there are mitigating health concerns. In this case, one is able to do a good work in place of this.

On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, we are also asked to fast (for those 18 to 59). Fasting means a person is permitted to eat one full meal during the day. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but they are not to equal that of a full meal. For those with mitigating health issues who are unable to fast and/or abstain, one is able to do a good work in place of these. While those are the only two days of fasting and abstinence required, all of Lent should be a time of spiritual formation and preparation for Easter. Also recommended are spiritual activities, such as spending more time studying the Scriptures, attending Mass more frequently, as well as the traditional Lenten Devotions (Stations of the Cross, Bible studies, Lenten talks and the Rosary), and other acts of sacrifice such as reaching out to those in need around us.

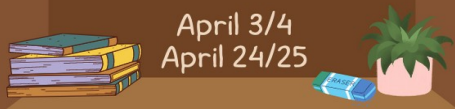

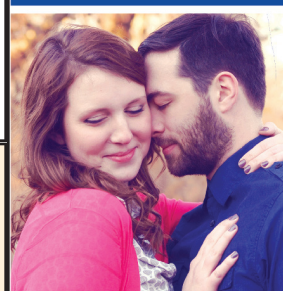
