APRIL 30, 2023 FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

THE GOOD SHEPHERD

An American tourist traveling in the Middle East came upon several shepherds whose flocks had intermingled while drinking water. After a while, one of the shepherds turned toward the sheep and called out, "Manah" which means "follow me" in Arabic. The sheep immediately separated themselves from the rest and followed. Then the next shepherd called out, "Manah" and his sheep followed him. The tourist asked the third shepherd, "I would like to try that." He put on the turban and called out to the sheep, "Manah." The sheep did not respond, not one. The shepherd explained that it is only when sheep are sick that they will follow any voice and not that of their shepherd.



Today Jesus refers to himself as the Good Shepherd who calls us to follow him. What an appropriate image for His relationship to each one of us.

In a world where we can sometimes feel like part of the crowd, Jesus knows each of us by name. He knows us better than we know ourselves. A good shepherd can close his eyes, and with his hands touch the face of each sheep and know that they are part of his flock. Jesus can tell when each of us is healthy, when we are in need and when we are thriving.

In a world where we are promised much, but are led to dry and arid areas, Jesus leads us to places of true pasture, where we can flourish. A shepherd knows that their job is to provide for all the sheep's needs. Each day, Jesus never neglects what is truly good for each of us.

Although we are free to leave the flock, our shepherd leaves the rest to seek us out when we are lost. He doesn't chastise us but puts us on his shoulders and brings us back home.

At night, the sheep are led into a protected area called a "sheepfold." Sometimes there are many flocks that stay together at night. There is only one way in and out. The shepherd then lies in this open space. No sheep can get out and no wolf can get in. In this way, the shepherd is the door that protects the sheep where they can stay, protected from all harm. In a dangerous world, Jesus is not like others who have no concern. He cares so much that he gave his life for each one of us.

Jesus is the Good Shepherd. He gathers us together in the Church, where we are called by name, united, nourished, healed, and protected from the storms of life. The Good Shepherd is the One in our lives who truly knows and cares more about us than anyone else. We don't have to have all the answers or always be in control. We just need to listen to the Good Shepherd and follow his voice. Jesus, the Good Shepherd tells us, "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life." There is no better way, no greater truth, no happier life. On Good Shepherd Sunday, this is the reason for our hope!



Dear Parishioners,

As homeowners, you know that there is extraordinary maintenance that must be done to your home over the years. In the same way, after 33 years our parish church and campus are in need of major capital repairs.

In the coming months, we plan to remove and replace the Church roof, repair our Atrium windows due to leaks, and repair water damage to the church façade in multiple places. Additionally, there are multiple HVAC units coming to the end of their useful lives that need to be replaced soon. As good stewards, we want to keep you updated on all the upcoming projects needed to ensure that our parish continues to thrive for years to come! After gathering information on each project, the estimated cost is approximately \$500K. This is more than we initially anticipated. Please see our posters in the Atrium and information online with all specific repairs and their estimated costs.

Together with the parish pastoral and finance councils, we decided to use some of the parish savings from a bequest to pay for these capital needs. Our parish savings were meant to secure the future of Corpus Christi for future generations but there is a need to use them now. Because of the financial uncertainty of many, we decided not to have a formal capital campaign with in-pew pledges, but to give all of those who are able the opportunity to help restore our savings which will be significantly reduced by the costs of these projects.


Please know that any funds collected in this initiative will be restricted to our *Restricted Building Fund* and can only be used for capital repairs and expenses associated with them.

There are special envelopes near the posters in the atrium and by the back entrance. You can give online at corpuschristi.org/preparing-for-the-future. Also, if you would like to give by check, please make it out to Corpus Christi Parish with the note "Restricted Building Fund" on the bottom of your check. All funds are restricted and can be used only for capital projects. They are also tax deductible. As your pastor, I will make a sacrificial gift as well. I invite you to join me and be a partner in funding our vision to bring Christ's Joy, Hope, and Healing to all those who come through our doors for another 33 years and beyond! We know that this is over and above your normal giving, and so we thank you in advance for all that you sacrifice for the future of our parish home.

Together let us celebrate the past and prepare for the future!

April 21, 2023 Memorial of Saint Anselm of Canterbury, Bishop and Doctor

Dear Father Corcoran:

In order to fulfill the norms of cc. 1043 and 1051, 2 of the Code of Canon Law, I request that you arrange for the publication of the banns concerning the ordination to the Sacred Order of the Diaconate of Mr. Joseph S. DeMarzo III of your parish. His Ordination is scheduled for May 20, 2023, at the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist in Paterson.

Christ's faithful are obliged to reveal impediments to sacred orders, if they know of any, to the ordinary or to the pastor before ordination. Moreover, as regards the inquiry concerning the qualities required of the man being ordained, the prescription is to be observed that a public announcement be employed for gaining information. Therefore, I ask that you publish the banns concerning the ordination of Mr. Joseph S. DeMarzo III, to the Sacred Order of the Diaconate by means of a public announcement and a notice in the parish bulletin. This should be made at the Masses on the weekend of April 29-30, May 6-7 and May 13-14.

When the publication has been made, please date, sign and seal this letter below as proof and return the entire letter to me at your earliest convenience.
