

June 4, 2023 The Most Holy Trinity

Trinity Sunday

Legend holds that St. Augustine was walking by the seashore one day contemplating the mystery of the Trinity when he saw a little child running from the water to a spot on the seashore. He was using a shell to carry water from the ocean and pour it into a small hole in the sand.

St. Augustine came up to him and asked him what he was doing. "I'm going to pour the entire ocean into this hole," he said. "That is impossible, my dear child, the sea is so great, and the shell and the hole are so little." "That is true," the boy said. "It would be easier and quicker to draw all the water out of the sea and fit it into this hole than for you to fit the mystery of the Trinity and His Divinity into your little intellect; for the Mystery of the Trinity is greater and larger in comparison with your intelligence than is this vast ocean in comparison with this little hole." The child then vanished.



At times, we describe God as creator, provider, friend, redeemer, and counselor. These describe how God acts, but God is more than these. At the core of God, God is a Trinity of three Persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Russian Orthodox Iconographer, Rublev, created an icon that sheds light on this mystery. In the icon above, there are three Persons sitting around a table. In front of the table, facing us, is an empty spot. The three people represent the Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The three sitting around the table represent the love shared between the Persons of the Trinity. A love that has existed for all eternity. Each Person only thinks about and loves the other. There is joy and peace and perfect harmony. This is what heaven is all about. It begins now!

In the middle of the table is food in a bowl. It is an image of the Eucharist, the divine food which draws us into the very life of God. This is why it is so important to receive. The Eucharist allows us to enter into this divine mystery. The empty spot is facing us for a reason. God has waited for all eternity to invite each of us to sit at this table, to share in the very life of the Trinity.

In order to sit in this spot, God asks us one thing. If he reserves a spot in his life for us, we must reserve a spot in our lives for others. We must make room in our hearts for others and see them as made in the image and likeness of the Trinity: the poor, the outcasts, the difficult to love, our enemies. We must open our hands in sharing ourselves and what we have to be a part of the solution of making a better world, a world worthy of the dignity of the Trinity.



We collected so far: \$180,000.00

Dear Parishioners,

As many of you are homeowners, you know that there is extraordinary maintenance that must be done to your home over the years. In the same way, after 33 years our parish church and campus are in need of major capital repairs.

In the coming months, we plan to remove and replace the Church roof, repair our Atrium windows due to leaks, and repair water damage to the church façade in multiple places. Additionally, there are multiple HVAC units coming to the end of their useful lives that need to be replaced soon.

As good stewards, we want to keep you updated on all the upcoming projects needed to ensure that our parish continues to thrive for years to come! After gathering information on each project, the estimated cost is approximately \$500K. This is more than we initially anticipated. Please see our posters in the Atrium and information online with all specific repairs and their estimated costs.

Together with the parish pastoral and finance councils, we decided to use some of the parish savings from a bequest to pay for these capital needs. Our parish savings were meant to secure the future of Corpus Christi for future generations but there is a need to use them now. Because of the financial uncertainty of many, we decided not to have a formal capital campaign with in-pew pledges, but to give all of those who are able to the opportunity to help restore our savings which will be significantly reduced by the costs of these projects.

Please know that any funds collected in this initiative will be restricted to our *Restricted Building Fund* and can only be used for capital repairs and expenses associated with them.

There are special envelopes near the posters in the atrium and by the back entrance. You can give online at corpuschristi.org/preparing-for-the-future. Also, if you would like to give by check, please make it out to Corpus Christi Parish with the note "Restricted Building Fund" on the bottom of your check. All funds are restricted and can be used only for capital projects. They are also tax deductible. This initiative will end June 30, 2023.

I invite you to join me and be a partner in funding our vision to bring Christ's Joy, Hope, and Healing to all those who come through our doors for another 33 years and beyond! We know that this is over and above your normal giving, and so we thank you in advance for all that you sacrifice for the future of our parish home.

Together let us celebrate the past and prepare for the future!

D-Day Knight

On June 6, 1944, among those Allied paratroopers dropping in the dark sky over Normandy was Father Francis Sampson, a young Catholic chaplain and a Knights of Columbus member. He was making his first combat jump. His weapons: a Mass kit and holy oils, items he soon would need.

He aided the wounded, held daily Mass and non-denominational prayer services, and heard confessions; all while surviving bombardments, a potential execution by two soldiers, a second airborne assault jumping behind enemy lines in Holland, being taken prisoner during the Battle of the Bulge, a 185-mile march of prisoners, and four months in a POW camp. He re-enlisted during the Korean War, making his third combat jump.

Fr. Sampson really lived the fourth principle of the Knights of Columbus: Patriotism.



Reflection...

I have been a steady fan of the PBS program "NOVA." I am particularly such when a program involves astronomy. The marvelous photos made by the latest telescopes present us with a universe we would never know without them. Of course the whole matter praises God, even if the show's featured scientists dare not mention His name.

I cannot help but give a spiritual take to those scenes because they represent the awesome power of God the Creator. Just trying to calculate the distance those stars and planets are from our own dear Earth confronts us with an imagination beyond our ability to comprehend.

Such facts brought about by this machine-led exploration is not only fascinating in itself, but also humbling in the extreme to us when we plot a simple trip to Mars. The key word here is "exploration."

When we set out to explore the notion of God, as revealed to us not by any machine, but by the Sacred Word of God in the Bible, we also enter a realm beyond our senses. Only through such revelation, direct from Jesus Christ, the Son of God via the Holy Spirit, would we ever know that God is One but Three distinct Persons. Our Catholic Church Catechism describes it thus: "The Trinity is a mystery of faith in the strict sense, one of the 'mysteries that are hidden in God, which can never be known unless they are revealed by God.' To be sure, God has left traces of His Trinitarian being in his work of creation and in his revelation throughout the Old Testament. But his inmost Being as Holy Trinity is a mystery that is inaccessible to reason alone or even to Israel's faith before the Incarnation of God's Son and the sending of the Holy Spirit." (#237)

Believing that this same God loves us personally, there is an implied bid here to do some of our own exploring. Call it "internal research." What does the doctrine of the Trinity mean for me? Is there really a place for me in the vast universe? Do I count with God? Jesus told us we do, but do we believe Him? For all of us, such research backed up by prayer could yield many new joys. "Nova" for short.

The business world has a saying that could apply to our need for this internal research. "The person who takes no inventories finally becomes bankrupt."

Trinity Sunday isn't for parsing the Three-in-One. It's an invitation to meditate on the mutual self-giving of Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier, who "so love the world" that we all share in the divine embrace. Yet to child victims of aggression, their experience has felt outside of any caring circle. That's why the U.N.'s "Convention on the Rights of the Child" was the most rapidly and widely ratified rights treaty in history. It ensures every child has a right to life, a name, family or guardian, health care, education, freedom of religion—even the right to play. Encircle the children in your life with tenderness.

Make your life a work of art

Artist and author on interreligious thought, Frederick Franck was born in 1909 in Holland and died on this day in 2006 in Warwick, New York—the place of his life's work, Pacem in Terris ("Peace on Earth"), a garden of more than 70 sculptures, open free to the public and dedicated to Pope John XXIII, Dr. Albert Schweitzer, and the Buddhist teacher D.T. Suzuki. Raised agnostic in a Catholic region of his country and a student of Zen Buddhism, Franck was inspired during the Cuban Missile Crisis to go to Rome in 1963 to draw all the sessions of the Second Vatican Council. "Art is neither a profession nor a hobby, it is a way of being," he said. Take inspiration to creatively express your spirituality in your own way of being.

One bread, one body

A painting by Flemish artist Peter Paul Rubens—called *The Defenders of the Eucharist*—includes a serene Saint Norbert, his white robes wrapped around a *ciborium* (the cup that holds the consecrated Eucharist) as he cradles the Blessed Sacrament. Norbert founded the Norbertine religious order as well as the first Third Order for laypeople embracing the spirit of religious life. And, as a successful peacemaker, he's often depicted with an olive branch. But Norbert's preaching about the Blessed Sacrament, convincing entire villages to reclaim their lost belief in the Real Presence—also having eucharistic miracles happen on his watch —has earned him the title "Apostle of the Blessed Sacrament." May he inspire our devotion as the National Eucharistic Revival enters its second phase this month.

Transcending prejudice in service to God

This day marks the 105th death anniversary of Servant of God Julia Greeley, one of seven African-American Catholics on the path to sainthood. She is one of two such candidates born into slavery in Ralls County, Missouri during the mid-19th century,

alongside Venerable Augustus Tolton. Freed during the Civil War, she emigrated to Colorado with her employer and became a Catholic due to their influence. There she would become known as "Denver's Angel of Charity" despite her own poverty, assisting the destitute at night so as not to offend her white beneficiaries. She died in 1918 and was the first and only Catholic layperson to lay in repose in the city—later becoming the first buried in the cathedral. May her legacy of service live on in all of us.

TODAY'S READINGS: Tobit 3:1-11a, 16-17a; Mark 12:18-27 (355). "When they rise from the dead, they neither marry nor are given in marriage, but they are like the angels in heaven."

Love begets love

It's June, a popular month for weddings in North America. Church teachings about marriage varied for the first millennium. Today they communicate high ideals, resting on this basic framework, paraphrased from the Catechism of the Catholic Church: God loves us with a definitive and irrevocable love; married couples share in this love, which supports and sustains them. Their faithfulness to each other witnesses God's persistent love. Many are called to marriage, but others follow a different path. How has God called you to share the love poured out on you?

TODAY'S READINGS: Tobit 6:10-11; 7:1bcde, 9-17; 8:4-9a; Mark 12:28-34 (356). "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength."

A troubled land calls for compassion

Saint Ephrem of Syria was a prolific writer of poetry, hymns, poems, sermons, and biblical commentaries. He has been called the most significant of all the fathers of the Syriac-speaking church tradition. He addressed the church in Syria in troubled times ... and Syria's troubles continue, perhaps never more acutely than today. Already suffering badly the devastation of 12 years of ruthless suppression, in February it suffered a devastating earthquake that killed more than 7,000 people and devastated more than 10,000 buildings in northwest Syria. The U.N. reports that more than 4 million Syrians, mostly women and children, depend on humanitarian aid to survive. Mercy USA invites donations for housing for destitute Syrians. Consider a donation in honor of Ephrem.

The widow's mite revisited

It is ironic that the story of the widow's mite in today's gospel is so often used as an example of generous giving when it's obvious that giving "all she had, her whole livelihood" had left her destitute and penniless. Jesus actually uses the widow's action as an example of what happens when the unscrupulous clergy of his day, with their long robes and the esteem of the people, "devour the houses of widows." The lesson is for religious leaders *not* to push poor people into deeper poverty. Pray for your pastors.

TODAY'S READINGS: Tobit 12:1, 5-15, 20; Mark 12:38-44 (358). "They devour the houses of widows They will receive a very severe condemnation."
