THE PATH TO HAPPINESS

His initials were W.W., and in the 1930s and 1940s they were enough to identify him to most of America. In 1943, when there were 140 million people in the United States, more than 50 million of them read his gossip column every day in more than 1000 newspapers, including his flagship, The New York Daily Mirror. Yet when he died in 1972, at age 74, he was practically forgotten. Only two people attended his funeral; his daughter, Walda, and the rabbi who officiated at his services. Today, almost no one remembers the name of Walter Winchell.



Walter Winchell lived in the illusion ---that life was about fame, influence and comfort. This is why Jesus presents the Beatitudes to the crowds in the Gospel today. Blessed are those who are poor, the hungry, the weeping, those who are hated.

Jesus isn't saying that these things are good in themselves. For Jesus, the beatitudes are God's plan for our happiness. The Beatitudes are like sledgehammers to tear down the illusions that present themselves to us each day. Jesus is reminding us that - happy are those who realize that we cannot on our own generate inner peace and happiness. Inner peace and happiness are always a gift from God.

When we start from a perspective that we really are dependent on God and act this way, we begin to see life as it really is. And we begin to let go of our attachments to power, possessions, experiences. Nothing can take the place of God!

Happy are those who realize that they are totally dependent on God and live this way!

FAITH AMID FLAMES

- Have a personal commitment to an active prayer/faith life.
- · Are willing to contribute individual talents/skills and treasure to the best of his/her ability.

Requirements to be a candidate for the September 2025 - May 2028 term:

- · Have been a registered member of the Parish for at least 6 months.
- Have received the Sacraments of Baptism, First Communion, and Confirmation*
- Are willing to serve a 3-year term, and are available to attend Council meetings (held on Saturday mornings, five (5) sessions per year,
 September through June)
- · Participate in some aspects of Parish Life.

*or are a teen preparing for confirmation; teens may choose to serve a 2-year term.
