Academic Team: Elyria Catholic's Academic Team has been a regular competitor on The Scholastic Games on WEOL 930 AM radio for15 years. The team has become involved in several other forms of competition, often traveling to other school locations for tournaments. We regularly appear on Academic Challenge on WEWS.

Altar Society: The purpose of the Altar Society is to give students the opportunity to be more actively engaged in the liturgy. **Senate:** Through developing leadership skills, Student Senate members promote school unity and spirit. Senate builds positive Christian attitudes that help not only the school but the community as well. Senate creates a link among the faculty, administration, students and the entire EC community. Student Senate members attend weekly meetings each Thursday after school.
