THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Nehemiah 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10

Ezra gathered the people and read to them from the book of the Law of God. He interpreted the law clearly, so that everyone understood what he had read. He then told them to go and rejoice in the Lord.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:12-30

Paul explains that a body is composed of many different parts, and that each part has its' own purpose and is important. He compares this to the Church, describing how we are one body composed of many members. All members should show concern for each other and understand that we are all vital to the body as a whole.

Gospel: Luke 1:1-4, 4:14-21

Luke discusses his decision to write about the events he and the other disciples had witnessed. He begins by telling of Jesus reading a passage from the book of Isaiah, where the anointed one is portrayed. Jesus finished by telling the people that they had seen that passage fulfilled in their hearing.

THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

About the Day We celebrate an event in Jesus's young life when his parents presented him at the Temple, as was Jewish custom. On the fortieth day after Jesus's birth, Mary and Joseph took their infant son to the Temple and presented him to God. They also offered the customary sacrifice for poor families, a pair of pigeons. But what is more significant is that while they were there. Simeon, a devout, holy man, recognized Jesus, took him into the his arms, and praised God saying, "Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel" (Lk 2:29-32). The elderly prophet, Anna, also recognized Jesus and "began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem" (Lk 2:38). Like Simeon and Anna, we recognize Jesus as the Light of the World, not only on the Feast of the Presentation, but every day of the year. We, as followers of Christ, are called to carry his light into the world. Because all candles used during the church year are blessed on this feast day, the day is also known as Candle mass.
