#### ANNOUNCEMENTS FROM THE ARCHDIOCESE

As you are likely aware, the state of New York has begun to lift or rollback many COVID19 pandemic restrictions. Yesterday, Governor Cuomo announced the following changes to these restrictions.

- Effective May 19, 2021, there will be no capacity restriction on houses of worship. However, the six-foot social distance requirement will remain in effect;
- Effective May 19, 2021, capacity for indoor nonessential gatherings is 250 persons, subject to physical distancing guidelines;
- Effective May 10, 2021, capacity for outdoor nonessential gatherings is 500 persons, subject to physical distancing guidelines (two meters).

Note that if you are planning a festival or feast and seek to exceed the 500-person outdoor gathering restriction, you may consider contacting your county health department for a final determination as to whether your event may exceed the 500-person occupancy limit;

• Mask restrictions are to remain in place for the time being.
