Notes from the Pastor's Desk

FR. LEWIS ... is continuing his rehab at the Rectory. He is very grateful to everyone for their continued thoughts and prayers.

PARISH OFFICE CLOSED ... In observance of President's Day, our office will be closed on Monday, February 15.

ASH WEDNESDAY ... Ash Wednesday, the beginning of our Lenten Season, falls on Wednesday, February 17. We will have two Masses that day ... 9:00AM at St. Patrick's and 7:00PM at St. Mary's. There will, however, be a difference this year. Instead of the priest or deacon marking each parishioner's forehead with the sign of the cross, ashes will be placed in individual cups. After the ashes are blessed, the priest will announce "Remember man or woman, you are dust and to dust you shall return". Then parishioners will come up the middle aisle to the front of the church and take a cup with ashes and a napkin for wiping off their finger, mark their foreheads with the ashes and dispose of the ashes and their napkin in the container provided. Please note that because the ashes are blessed they must be disposed of properly.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS ... During Lent, we will have Stations of the Cross starting on Ash Wednesday and continuing each Wednesday at St. Patrick's and on Fridays at St. Mary's after the 9:00AM Masses.

OPERATION RICE BOWL ... Rice Bowls are available in the downstairs church lobby for those who wish to participate. The bowls can be returned during Holy Week.

SPECIAL COLLECTION ... Next weekend, we take up a second special collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe. This collection supports the Church in more than 25 countries that still struggle to recover from former communist rule. LENTEN REGULATIONS 2021

- 1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting (for ages 18 to 59).
- 2. All Fridays of Lent, including Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, are days of abstinence from meat (for ages 14 and older).
- 3. The entire season of Lent should be observed in a spirit of prayer and penance, such as extra time in prayer, attending daily Mass, voluntary sacrifices and self denial, works of charity and service to others.
- All Cathólics who have reached the age of reason must confess their serious sins in the Sacrament of Penance and receive Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter Season (February 21, the First Sunday of Lent, until Trinity Sunday, May 30).
- 5. Although other seasons are more suitable, the celebration of marriage and the Nuptial Mass are not forbidden during Lent, according to the New Code of Canon Law.
