#### **DAILY MEDITATION: ACTS 2:1-11**

... from every nation under heaven. (Acts 2:5)

Today's first reading makes it pretty clear: the Holy Spirit wants everyone to hear the good news and come together through faith in Jesus. Men and women from all over the known world were in Jerusalem for the feast of Pentecost, and they didn't all speak the same language. But when the Spirit came upon the believers gathered in the upper room, that massive crowd heard the disciples proclaiming God's mighty works in their own languages, and that manifestation of God's power helped them come to believe!

That miracle of God gathering people from all over the world wasn't limited to the first Pentecost. Consider Philip preaching to the Ethiopian court official (Acts 8:26-40) or Peter preaching to the Roman centurion Cornelius (10:34-48) or Paul preaching to the philosophers of Athens (17:22-34). The Spirit came in power both upon those who preached and those who heard. He broke down barriers and brought people together through the gospel.

The Holy Spirit still wants to dismantle walls between people from all walks of life and bring them together. And by virtue of your baptism, you are called to participate in that mission.

How? You can start right where you live. You're sure to encounter someone who might not "speak your language." Maybe someone in your family or among your neighbors has a different worldview than you do. Maybe there are people who come from a different country or from a different generation. Bring Jesus to them. Just say a prayer, open your mouth, and trust the Spirit to work through you to bring them together.

The Holy Spirit is still eager to bring us all together in Christ. Let him fill you on this special day!

"Holy Spirit, give me the words to proclaim the good news wherever I go."



Frequently Asked Questions On Sacred Music The Pentecost Sequence

Pentecost is one of four days during the year when the Church asks us to chant the Sequence, a special hymn that is inserted between the second reading and the Gospel Acclamation.

We also sing a Sequence on Easter Day (Victimae Paschali), Corpus Christi (Lauda Sion), and the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows (Stabat Mater).

The Sequence for Pentecost is "Veni Sancte Spiritus". Sometimes known as the "Golden Sequence", this is an anonymous text that dates from the twelfth or thirteenth centuries.

The hymn begins with an invocation of the Holy Spirit, asking the Spirit to come and fill the hearts of the faithful. It then goes on to describe the many gifts that the Spirit bestows, concluding with a prayer for the coming of the Holy Spirit and for the outpouring of the Spirit's gifts upon the Church.

The traditional melody that we sing to this ancient text has been used at Pentecost for centuries. Like the author of the hymn, the composer of the melody is anonymous.

We join all the Catholics that have come before us across the centuries as we proclaim this ancient hymn once again on this glorious Solemnity.

## What is Sacred Liturgy?

After the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965), when the word liturgy sprang into more common usage, its definition (from the Greek *leitourgia*) – the work of the people or work on behalf of the people – soon resulted in an emphasis solely on the first, rather than the more important second understanding. Some explain this as a consequence of the Council's call for "full, active and conscious

participation" (Sacrosanctum Concilium 2, 14) in the worship of the Church as the "right and duty" of the Christian people, particularly as individuals and the entire assembly gradually assumed a more active role in liturgical celebrations. It is true that, immediately

after the liturgical reforms of Vatican II, the tendency was to focus on the assembly's role in the celebration of the Liturgy while failing to recognize the more important "work of God" being accomplished in the assembly's midst. While a better balance in understanding both aspects of the Liturgy now exists, an even greater grasp of what the Church believes and teaches about the Sacred Liturgy will bring forth much fruit for the life of the Church.

Vatican II's Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy,

Sacrosanctum Concilium (SC), reminds us that "in order that the liturgy may be able to produce its full effects, it is necessary that the faithful come to it with proper dispositions," (SC, 11) in short, we must be prepared.

If we are prepared, we will realize that the Sacred Liturgy is the Church's official public and communal worship.

But it is more than that.



As we prepare, we must realize that the Eucharistic Feast is "the font from which all her power flows" (SC, 10) and simultaneously, it is "the summit toward which the activity of the Church is directed" (SC, 10).

As our source and summit, Sacred Liturgy moves the faithful to be "one in holiness" (SC, 10).

Imagine that: prepare, celebrate, and be joined with one another in holiness. What a gift!

As the Church's principal act of worship, the Liturgy also includes the celebration of the six additional sacraments, the official daily prayer of the Church (the Liturgy of the Hours), and liturgies for special celebrations. As the Church's official worship, each of these liturgies has at its heart the celebration of the "Mystery of our Faith" – that is, the sacred Passion, Death and Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ. This mystery, known as the Paschal Mystery, is the continuing work of our redemption by Christ and through his Church.

#### [ 오순절의 성령 강림 ]

순절의 성령 강림 사건은 교회의 역사 안에서 굉장히 중요한 사건입니다. 이 사건을 통해 사도들의 복음 선포 여정이 시작되었으며, 교회가 지금의 세계적인 모습으로 성장한 첫 발걸음이기도 합니다. 그래서 부활시기의 마지막 날인 성령 강림 대축일을 교회가 탄생한 날로 기념합니다. 이때 성당에서는 성령의 일곱 은사가 쓰여 있는 성령칠은 카드를 뽑기도 합니다.

오순절의 성령 강림 사건은 예수님께서 승천하시기 전 에 사도들에게 하셨던 '성령으로 세례를 받을 것이다.'(사 도 1.5)라는 말씀이 이루어지는 순간이며, 그리스도인들의 세 례가 완성되는 순간입니다. 성령 강림은 신약의 사건이지 만 구약과 깊은 연관을 맺고 있습니다. '오순절'은 유다인들 이 파스카 다음 50일째 되는 날에 지내는 추수감사절과 같 은 명절입니다.(레위 23,15-21) 그러나 유다인들은 그날 을 시나이 사건과 연관 지으면서 율법을 받은 일을 경축하 고 그 계약을 갱신하는 축제일로 지냈습니다. 이날에 성령 강 림의 사건이 일어났다는 것은 예수 그리스도의 죽음과 부활 이 바로 새로운 파스카이며, 이를 통해 새로운 하느님 백성 이 탄생했음을 의미합니다. 또한 이 날은 예레미야의 "나 는 이스라엘 집안과 유다 집안과 새 계약을 맺겠다."(예 레 31,31)는 예언과 에제키엘의 "너희에게 새 마음을 주고 너 희 안에 새 영을 넣어 주겠다."(에제 36,26)의 예언이 성취되 었음이 선포되는 날입니다. 그래서 초대 교회 신자들은 구약



에서 드러난 하느님의 언약이 자신들에게 성취되었다는 믿음 안에서, 자신들이 구원의 새 언약 공동체라는 자부심을 가지고 있었습니다.

또한 성령 강림을 통해 드러난 표징은 제자들이 하는 말을 '저마다 태어난 지방말'(사도 2,8)로 알아듣는 것입니다. 이는 성령께서 모든 사람이 서

로 통하고 이해할 수 있도록 교회에 힘을 주신다는 것을 전하면서, 성령 안에서 세상 모든 이들이 다양성 안의 일치를 이루게 될 것임을 드러낸 것입니다. 그렇지만 성령 강림의 사건을 바라보는 사람들의 시선은 제각각입니다. 어떤 이들은 놀라워하면서 어쩔 줄 몰라 하지만, 더러는 "새 포도주에 취했군."하며 비웃습니다. 지금도 마찬가지입니다. 세상의 많은 그리스도인은 복음 선포를 통해 진정한 인간의 삶이 어떤 것인지 보여주고 있습니다. 그렇지만 어떤 이들은 이를 무시하고 어떤 이들은 이러한 그리스도인의 삶에 감명을 받아 세례를 받습니다. 이처럼 한쪽은 비웃지만, 한쪽은 복음 말씀을 받아들이면서 교회는 성장하고 있습니다. 세상은 아무리 교회를 비웃는다고 해도 복음 선포는 그리스도인 증거자와 성령을 통해 계속되고 있습니다.
