DAILY MEDITATION: 1 CORINTHIANS 1:22-25

... Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. (1 Corinthians 1:24)

The words roll off our tongues so easily. Of course Jesus is God's wisdom and power! He's the Son of God, after all. But what do these words mean? Today's readings can help us.

First, there's Jesus as the wisdom of God. The story of the Ten Commandments in the first reading shows us that God's commands are nothing more—and nothing less—than a revelation of his own divine wisdom. They reveal how he wants his children to live: by loving God and one another. This is the wisdom that Jesus lived out perfectly. In everything he said and did, he showed us what it is like to love God completely and to pour ourselves out in love for the people around us. And nowhere is this revealed more powerfully than when he laid down his life on the cross! As for Jesus being the power of God, what could be more astounding than his promise in today's Gospel to rebuild the "temple of his body" after three days (John 2:21)? Imagine the kind of power it took for Jesus' crucified, lifeless flesh to come back to life! Imagine the power that transformed his body into something radiant and glorious! That was a work that only God, by his own mighty power, could do!

These are not just historical facts. The power and wisdom of God are present today—and they're yours in Christ! Every act of love, forgiveness, and generosity that you perform demonstrates his wisdom to a world lost in folly. Every time you pray in confident intercession, every time you rely on God's grace to say no to temptation, and every time you lay down your life to care for someone, you are revealing the power of God.

That's right. You can be God's revelation to this world!

FROM THE PASTOR

THE SCRUTINIES

Since last fall over 10 members of the Korean community of our parish have been preparing to enter the Church or to be received into full communion with the Church. As part of their preparation they will undergo three Scrutinies, celebrated on the third, fourth and fifth Sunday of Lent. Although our parish will celebrate the three Scrutinies only during the Korean Mass on those Sundays, it is worth explaining what these Scrutinies are. They are described by the Church as:

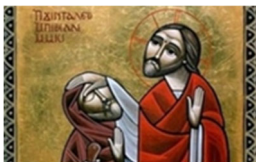
“rites for self-searching and repentance, which are meant to uncover, then heal, all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong and good. The Scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth and the life. These rites, therefore, should complete the conversion of the elect and deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out their decision to love God above all.”

The Gospels on the three Sundays on which the Scrutinies are celebrated teach the elect about the mystery of sin, and fill them with the Spirit of Christ.

The Gospel for the **First Scrutiny** is the story of Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well and it tells us that Christ is the Living Water. The primary symbol in the reading of this Sunday is water. Water is a symbol of life, and it indicates that God wishes to give us life, as shown in the stories of the Israelites in the desert and the woman from Samaria at the well. The symbol of water also indicates baptism, and looks forward to Easter when this is celebrated.



The Gospel for the **Second Scrutiny** is the story of the healing of the man born blind. The key idea in Gospel and the Second Reading is turning from darkness to light, as symbolized in the healing of the man born blind. For example, examination of conscience, especially in the light of God's Word, leads to enlightenment, and thus enables people to do as St. Paul says, “Try to discover what the Lord wants of you, having nothing to do with the futile works of darkness.”



And the Gospel for the **Third Scrutiny** is the story of the raising of Lazarus from the dead. The Third Scrutiny emphasizes Jesus as “the Resurrection and the Life”. Jesus in his obedience to his Father has the authority to give life to whom he will. The raising of Lazarus is an anticipation of what is to take place on the last day. It means that the believer has eternal life; and has passed from death to life. It is also – again – an anticipation of what is celebrated at Easter and in Baptism, resurrection and eternal life.



Jesus describes the purpose of his mission as “To give life in abundance” (John 10:10). Each of the Gospels proclaimed in the three Scrutinies illustrates this.

The Scrutinies include a 'Rite of Exorcism' which may sound a little scary, but is a prayer for the Elect to free them from sin, protect them from the power of Satan and help them towards salvation. Please keep all our Catechumens and Candidates in your prayers!

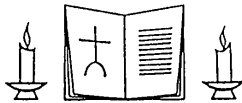

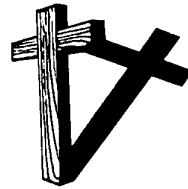
