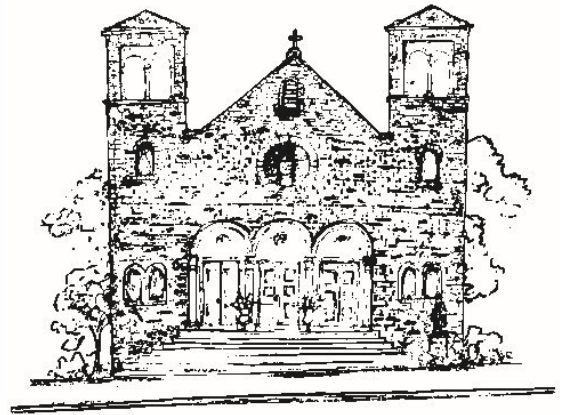

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DAILY MEDITATION: LUKE 4:1-13

If you are the Son of God . . . (Luke 4:3)

Well, that's one way for the devil to try to trip Jesus up! Get him to doubt his Father's love and care for him. Come on, Jesus! You're the Son of God. You don't need to punish yourself like this. Look, here are some rocks you could use!

Or, Son of God? No one will ever believe you—you look like an everyday carpenter. If you want followers, you need to do something dramatic. I know! How about jumping off the roof of the Temple? That will draw people to yourself much more quickly! But as tempting as all this must have been, Jesus could see through the devil's twisted logic. Being the Son of God isn't about special perks and privileges. It isn't about never going hungry or never being able to walk out the front door without being met by admirers. It's about being like your Father: pouring yourself out to lift up the wounded. It's about loving everyone selflessly, even if it means giving up your life on a cross. As a child of God, you, too, will encounter temptations this Lent. You may be tempted to hold a grudge, to treat someone poorly, or to break your Lenten resolutions—or to commit any number of sins. But no matter what you face, it's founded on some version of the lie that the devil tried to use on Jesus. It's the false notion that God is holding something back from you, so you'll need to bend some rules—or break them—so you can get what you think you need. As the old saying goes, "Forewarned is forearmed." So when you find yourself wanting to justify sin, recognize the voice of the tempter and stand firm. When you find yourself doubting God's goodness, label those thoughts as coming from our enemy, the accuser. And run to Jesus for help. He knows exactly how to overcome the devil!

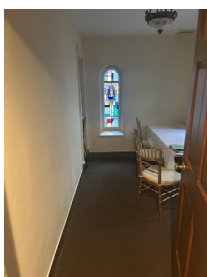
Dear Parishioners,

Last week we celebrated Ash Wednesday, traditionally the beginning of the season of Lent. This is a time of reflection, penance and spiritual growth preparing us for the celebration of the mystery of Easter. I would like to remind you of the importance of this wonderful season by examining our stewardship commitments of time, talent and treasure. This period is not just about giving up certain luxuries, but also about renewing our commitment to God, deepening our faith, and serving others with a generous heart.

As we journey through this Lenten season together, we are reminded of the importance of examining our stewardship commitment in all aspects of our lives. This sacred time offers us an opportunity to reflect on how we contribute to the mission of our faith community and how we support the work of the Church in nurturing both our spiritual and physical spaces.

In commemoration of our centenary, we are embarking on a fundraising campaign to help us complete three vital projects that our Finance and Parish Councils have identified and that will serve our congregation and the broader community for years to come:

- **Restoring the Front Steps of the Church:** The front steps are not only a welcoming symbol but also a critical part of maintaining accessibility for all who come to worship and seek solace. This project will ensure that the entrance to our church is safe, inviting, and dignified.



- **Creating a Family Room in the Back of the Church:** In the last couple of years our parish has been blessed with an increase of young families who have joined our parish. In the last two months alone we have celebrated 5 baptisms. Creating a welcoming space for families with young children to worship, reflect, and gather after the Mass is more important than ever.

- **Renovating the Kitchen in the Church Hall:** A well-equipped and functional kitchen is essential for the many gatherings, meals, and outreach efforts that take place in our church hall. The renovation of this space will support the ongoing work of feeding the hungry, hosting events, and building relationships among our congregation.



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Our goal for this fundraiser is to raise **\$80,000** which will help us to cover the cost of these projects. I am very grateful to announce that we have already received a very generous donation of \$20,000 from one parishioner towards the renovation of our front steps. But we still need your help to reach our target goal and bring these projects to life.

As we reflect on our own individual commitments of time, talent, and treasure, I encourage you to prayerfully consider how you can contribute to this campaign. Whether it's through a financial donation, volunteering your time, or offering your talents to support the effort, every contribution matters. Together, we can make a meaningful difference in our faith community and in the world around us.

Finally, I would ask you to consider participating in one or all of our Lenten parish activities:

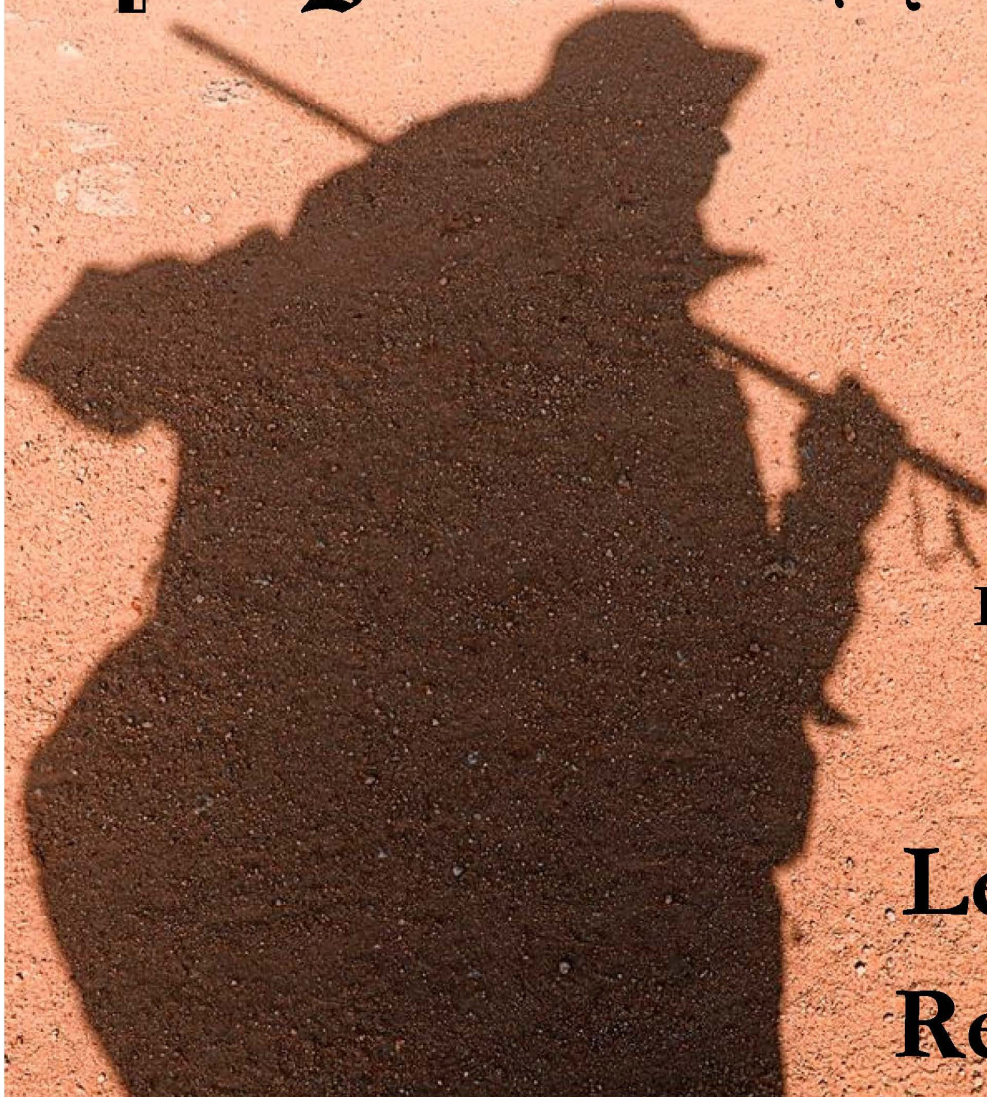

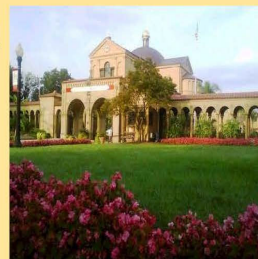
