THE MUSINGS OF THE PASTOR

I have been impressed by a call to prayer issued by Archbishop William E. Lori of Baltimore, chair of the U. S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee on Pro-Life Activities, in response to the leak of a draft opinion in the Supreme Court Case of *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*. Let me quote what he says:

"The leak related to the U.S. Supreme Court case of Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization reminds us of the urgent need of prayer and action at this pivotal moment in our country.

"As Catholics, we care about every unborn child and mother. Our Church has consistently witnessed in word and deed that life begins at the moment of conception. As the bishops shared in our statement Standing with Moms in Need: we pledge to 'redouble our efforts to accompany women and couples who are facing unexpected or difficult pregnancies, and during early years of parenthood, offering them loving and compassionate care through initiatives such as Walking with Moms in Need and countless others."

"At the same time, as we await the Court's decision, we urge everyone to intensify their prayer and fasting that the final decision of the Court will bring about the reversal of Roe and Casey.

"We hope and pray for a change in our laws and stand ready to help all pregnant women in need in each of our communities.

"Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us and guide us."

Archbishop Lori mentioned the USCCB statement *Standing with Moms in Need* in his call to prayer. I think it would be helpful to mention some of the items to which the Bishops urge our dioceses, parishes, and Catholic agencies and institutions to recommit themselves:

- To redouble our efforts to accompany women and couples who are facing unexpected or difficult pregnancies, and during the early years of parenthood, offering them loving and compassionate care through initiatives such as *Walking with Moms in Need* and countless others.
- To ensure our Catholic parishes are places of welcome for women facing challenging pregnancies or who find it difficult to care for their children after birth, so that any mother needing assistance will receive life-affirming support and be connected with appropriate programs and resources where she can get help.
- To help Catholics recognize the needs of pregnant and parenting moms in their communities, enabling parishioners to know these mothers, to listen to them, and to help them obtain the necessities of life for themselves and their children.

ON MAY 21, JOIN US FOR CLEANUP DAY OF PARISH GROUNDS



JUSTICE THOUGHT

An inspiration for us, as we reflect on racial injustices and our failure to recognize Jesus in our neighbor, may be Harriet Tubman. Harriet was a saintly woman who escaped from slavery and then returned to free hundreds of other slaves through the Underground Railroad. It is both painful and compelling to think her story took place right here in Maryland.

Harriet accomplished her heroic work by listening to God's voice. The courage and confidence she derived from her relationship with God led her through narrow escapes and rugged, exhausting journeys. She was her *brother's keeper*, literally, as she risked her life to free others who were enslaved.

They called her "Moses" because she delivered her own people from slavery.

Perhaps her gift to us is her faith in God and trust in His constant care for her. Amid her suffering and chronic pain (Harriet sustained a serious head injury when young), she placed her full confidence in Him. Harriet called on God to be her guide in every situation yet did not marvel when He delivered her. She already knew He would.

She was a devout Christian. Although she never learned to read or write, she knew the scriptures by heart; she cited them in ordinary conversations with people and when she spoke publicly. She was spiritually wise and evangelized at every opportunity. This holy woman prayed for the conversion of her slave owner, willing his good; something very hard for one to do when being oppressed. Pope Francis speaks of the saints in our midst. Not all of them are canonized but they can by their powerful example lead us to a deeper conversion.

Ouestions:

- 1. In what ways do I publicly witness to the Christian life?
- 2. Our parish has so many saints who work tirelessly in the St. Vincent de Paul Society, the St. Martin's Food Pantry, the Knights of Columbus, the Haiti Mission and with Pax Christi welcoming and settling refugees. Do one or more of these ministries offer *me* a way to be *my brother's keeper*?
