THE MUSINGS OF THE PASTOR

After the canonization of the seven new Saints in Saint Peters Square in Rome on Sunday October 19. 2025, Pope Leo XIV addressed the pilgrims who traveled from all over the world for the event. He described the celebration in which saints were canonized as one that reminded us that the communion of the church embraced all the faithful, across space and time, in every language and culture, uniting us as the people of God, the body of Christ, and the living temple of the Holy Spirit.

Among the Saints who were canonized were two from Venezuela: Saints José Gregorio Hernández and Saint Carmen Rendiles. Pope Leo XIV highlighted their heroic virtues of faith hope and charity and invited the faithful gathered to use them for guidance for today. The Pope reminded us that faith transforms ordinary life into light for others. Hope reminds us that the struggles are not for fleeting ends; and charity, born from receiving God's plan moves us to serve the sick the poor and the small. The Holy Father also encouraged those present to see in those around them "brothers and sisters called to the same holiness," walking together in building God's kingdom with joy.

Let me say a few words about Saint José Gregorio Hernández, a Venezuelan physician, scientist, and layman who is revered as the doctor of the poor. He was born on October 26, 1864, in Isnotú in the Venezuelan state of Trujillo. When he was 13, he expressed his desire to go to law school, but his mother convinced him to study medicine. He therefore went to Caracas to study: first at a prestigious academy and then at the medical school of the Universidad Central de Venezuela (UCV), where he was considered a brilliant student. After graduating in 1888, he received a grant from the Venezuelan government to pursue studies in Europe under prominent experts, where he delved into histology, bacteriology, and pathology. Returning to Venezuela in 1893, he founded chairs in those subjects at the UCV, while practicing at a teaching hospital. He was the author of numerous scientific and medical research works as well as some literary essays. He attended daily Mass, brought medicine and care to the poor. He became a Secular Franciscan at the Capuchin church in Caracas in 1899. He attempted to study for the priesthood at two different times, but his delicate health forced him to withdraw from the seminary. After some time, Hernández concluded it was God's will for him to remain a layman. He decided to promote sanctification as an exemplary Catholic by being a doctor and giving glory to God by serving the sick. He devoted himself to academic research and deepened his dedication to serving the poor.

Dr. José Gregorio became especially well-known for his self-less labors on behalf of the sick during the great influenza epidemic of 1918, becoming known in Caracas as the "doctor of the poor," often buying medicines for them out of his own pocket. One day, as Doctor Hernández went to pick up medicine for an elderly poor woman, he was struck by a car. He died in the hospital on June 29, 1919. He was beatified by Pope Francis on April 30, 2021, and, as I have already mentioned, was canonized by Leo XIV on October 19, 2025. Saint José Gregorio Hernández, pray for us!

CONCRETE WORK CONTINUES ON THE PARISH GROUNDS, WEATHER PERMITTING

The concrete work on the parish grounds that began November 17 is progressing nicely with the demolition of the outdoor steps outside the Parish Center entrance and the pouring of new concrete steps to replace them. This past week, demolition and replacement of the concrete steps leading up to the side entrances of the church should have began; the contractor working on this phase will finish by replacing the brick steps from the parking lot to the Rectory with concrete steps. Next up will be installation of a new sidewalk along the lower parking lot and new ramps at the main entrance of the church, making them compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act. Weather permitting, this work should be finished by December 5. Care will be taken to limit work noise whenever liturgies in the church are underway. Please be careful entering the church, as we improve our 50-year-old parish grounds, thanks to the generosity of donors to our recent capital campaign. Thank you!



Music Notes

At the 9:30 am Mass on November 30, our closing hymn, "Savior of the Nations Come," is quite ancient. The text, "Veni, Redemptor gentium" in the original Latin, was written by Ambrose of Milan, who is famously remembered for his role in the conversion of St. Augustine of Hippo. We should remember Ambrose not only as a bishop and gifted rhetorician, but also as a hymnist who wrote Latin hymns for his congregation to sing. Ambrose's text proclaimed the divinity of Jesus, thereby also combatting the Arian heresy of the times, which posited that Jesus was not truly divine. The English translation that we sing is a translation of the German "Nun Komm, der Heiden Heiland" which Martin Luther adapted from Ambrose's original Latin text. The tune paired with this hymn text is an adaptation of a Gregorian chant melody. It appeared with Luther's text in the first Lutheran hymn collection Geistliche Gesangbüchlein (translated as Spiritual Songbook) in 1524.
