### THE MUSINGS OF THE PASTOR

In my column today I want to print what is probably the most reprinted editorial in any newspaper in the English language. This has become a Christmas custom for me. I am happy to do it again this year. Enjoy!

In 1897, the New York Sun received a letter to the Editor from Virginia O'Hanlon, who was eight years old and a resident of New York City. Her letter was only four sentences long:

*Dear Editor:*

*I am eight years old. Some of my little friends say there is no Santa Claus. Papa says: "If you see it in THE SUN it's so. Please tell me the truth: is there a Santa Claus? Virginia O'Hanlon. 115 West Ninety-Fifth Street.*

Francis Pharcellus Church was the editor of THE SUN who was assigned to answer little Virginia's letter. Church had served as a war correspondent during the American Civil War, a time that saw a great deal of suffering and lack of hope and faith in much of society. He saw in Virginia's letter (for which she may have had some help in composition from her father, Dr. Philip O'Hanlon) an opportunity to address this. Let's enjoy reading this wonderful piece on this Christmas day.

Virginia, your little friends are wrong. They have been affected by the skepticism of a skeptical age. They do not believe except they see. They think that nothing can be which is not comprehensible by their little minds. All minds, Virginia, whether they be men's or children's, are little. In this great universe of ours man is a mere insect, an ant, in his intellect, as compared with the boundless world about him, as measured by the intelligence capable of grasping the whole truth and knowledge.

Yes, Virginia, there is a Santa Claus. He exists as certainly as love and generosity and devotion exists, and you know that they abound and give joy to your life its highest beauty and joy. Alas! How dreary would the world be if there were no Santa Claus. It would be as dreary as if there were no Virginias. There would be no childlike faith then, no poetry, no romance to make tolerable this existence. We should have no enjoyment, except in sense and delight. The eternal light with which childhood fills the world would be extinguished.

Not believe in Santa Claus! You might as well not believe in fairies! You might get your papa to hire men to watch in all the chimneys on Christmas Eve to watch Santa Claus, but even if they did not see Santa Claus coming down, what would that prove? Nobody sees Santa Claus, but that is no sign there is no Santa Claus. The most real things in the world are those that neither children nor men can see. Did you ever see fairies dancing on the lawn? Of course not, but that's not proof that they are not there. Nobody can conceive or imagine all the wonders that are unseen and unseeable in the world.

## Music Notes

At the 9:30 am Mass today, our opening hymn, "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" is sometimes referred to by the title "O Antiphons," and the Church has been singing these texts since at least the 8th century. These seven antiphons accompany the Magnificat canticle of vespers, or evening prayer, from December 17-23. Today, the St. Francis choir sings a setting of this ancient Advent hymn written by the 20th century Hungarian composer Zoltán Kodály (1882-1967). Kodály set five of the seven antiphons. The brief translation is as follows for each of the five verses: O Come Emmanuel and ransom captive Israel; O come, rod of Jesse's stem, and deliver your people out of the enemy's claw; O Come Thou dayspring, and dispel the darkness; O Come Key of David and unlock the heavenly kingdom; O Come Adonai/Lord of might who gave the law to the people on Sinai. Rejoice, rejoice! Emmanuel will be born for you, Israel.

## PARISH TAKES PART IN #IGIVE CATHOLIC FUNDRAISING CAMPAIGN

The parish engaged with the #iGiveCatholic campaign in late November and early December to raise funds to boost the parish's income, Fr. John reported to the Parish Pastoral Council at its meeting on December 4.

Fr. John said the Parish sent out a mailing December 1, explaining the need for parishioners to give one-time financial gifts to #iGiveCatholic, a national initiative associated with the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops to encourage generosity among Catholics. "We didn't do an offertory campaign this year, so I thought we should do this," he said.

Although total donations given online and offline haven't been officially tallied, the preliminary response shows that the parish surpassed its \$5,000 fundraising goal.

In other business, the council also heard reports on:

- Status of the campus improvements funded by the capital campaign.
- Work of the Communications Ministry, which includes submitting stories for the December issue of *Our Parish Times* and adding new content for the Youth Ministry page on the web site.
- The challenging time families served by the New Neighbor Interfaith Alliance are having.
- The success of the film screening of "A Place at the Table: African Americans on the Path to Sainthood" on November 15.
- Knights of Columbus Council 2323 activities in November and December.
- The need for adults to drive parish youth to the Mount 2000 Retreat in Emmitsburg.

### La parroquia participa en #iGiveCatholic campaña de recaudación de fondos

La parroquia participó en la campaña de #iGiveCatholic a finales de noviembre y principios de diciembre para recaudar fondos que impulsaran los ingresos de la parroquia; el padre John informó al Consejo Pastoral Parroquial en su reunión del 4 de diciembre.

El padre John dijo que la Oficina Parroquial envió un correo el 1 de diciembre, explicando la necesidad de que los feligreses hagan donaciones económicas puntuales a #iGiveCatholic, una iniciativa nacional asociada con la Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de Estados Unidos para fomentar la generosidad entre los católicos. "Este año no hicimos una campaña de ofertas, así que pensé que deberíamos hacerlo", dijo.

Aunque las donaciones totales realizadas en línea y fuera de línea no se han contabilizado oficialmente, la respuesta preliminar muestra que la parroquia superó su objetivo de recaudación de fondos de 5,000 dólares.
