**THE MUSINGS OF THE PASTOR**

We celebrate Catholic Schools Week from the last Sunday of January through the following Saturday. In other words, today marks the start of Catholic Schools Week 2026. As I think back to my time as a student at St. Paul School in Butler, Pennsylvania, I remember that my teachers, Sisters of Mercy, were originally from the Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown. They came from cities and towns like Altoona, Bedford, Ebensburg, Johnstown, New Germany, Portage, and Spangler. A few were even from Butler! The students at St. Paul School in my time often heard stories about the Johnstown Flood and Prince Demetrius Gallitzin (1770-1840). I want to devote this column to Prince Gallitzin, who spent many years as the sole priest in Western Pennsylvania.

Demetrius Gallitzin came from a very aristocratic background. His father, a Russian prince served as ambassador to Holland. His mother was a German countess who also happened to be a devout Catholic who imparted her Catholic faith to her son. While making a tour of America in the early 1790's, Demetrius was struck by the needs of the struggling Catholic Church. Deciding to become a Catholic priest, he was accepted as a seminarian by Bishop John Carroll and enrolled in the new seminary in Baltimore in November 1792. His father was shocked and horrified by this news. Demetrius was ordained in 1795 by Bishop Carroll. He was the first to make all his theological studies in the United States. After ordination he was sent to work on a church mission at Port Tobacco, Maryland. He was then transferred to the Conewago district where he served at the Conewago Chapel, located in Hanover, Pennsylvania, until 1799.

In 1799 he used his own fortune to purchase land for a new Catholic settlement in Loretto, Pennsylvania. For many years he was the only Catholic priest west of the Alleghenies, covering territory that is now part of the Dioceses of Pittsburgh, Erie, Greensburg, Altoona-Johnstown, and Harrisburg. Carving up this settlement out of the wilderness was arduous. In addition to buying tracts of land for settlers, he set up sawmills, tanneries, and other industries to support them. Although he had expected to inherit his parents' fortune, he found himself disinherited by a decree from the Russian government on account of his ordination as a Catholic priest.

Having spent himself both physically and financially for the sake of his flock he died on May 6, 1840. On June 6, 2005, he was named a Servant of God. Let me end this column with this quote: *"The ministers of Christ, in 1815, scattered over the globe, preach likewise one and the same doctrine, because Christ is still with them"*

—Servant of God Demetrius Gallitzin.

**INSTALLATION OF CHURCH'S  
NEW HEATING, VENTILATION,  
AND AIR CONDITIONING SYSTEM  
WILL COMMENCE JANUARY 26**

The installation of our church's new heating, ventilation, and air conditioning system will start Monday, January 26, impacting church operations for potentially four or five days. While heat will continue running in the church on Monday, it will be turned off Tuesday during the day. As additional units are installed on Tuesday and Wednesday, some heat will run but the church won't be fully heated until Thursday or Friday of this week.

A large tractor trailer holding the four units and a large crane will be on the parish grounds, possibly, blocking access to the entrance of the church. There will also be heavy equipment on the church grounds behind the Parish Center.

Impacts on daily Mass and ministries' use of the Kuehner Room, church and Parish Center were still being determined at the time of the bulletin's press run. Parishioners will be informed of further church impacts by Flocknote or text, as more is known.

This major improvement to our church is the result of parishioners' generous contributions to the 2025 Upgrading our Parish Home for Our Children's Children Capital Campaign. Thank you to all those parishioners who contributed to make this improvement a reality!
