

THE MUSINGS OF THE PASTOR

As I mentioned in my column last week, Robert Cardinal McElroy has met with over four hundred lay leaders from our parishes over the last year to get their input on establishing some pastoral goals for the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Washington for the next five years. At the Priest Convocation that Fr. G. and I attended in November 2025, the priests at the convocation were asked to formulate six goals for the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Washington based on the input from the four hundred or so lay leaders.

More recently Bishop Juan Esposito, Vicar General and Moderator of the Curia, wrote to the priests of the Archdiocese of Washington that Cardinal McElroy has assigned a Pastoral Goals Task Force to seek further input from priests and their communities. The intent of the survey is to collect ideas and existing resources, programs, and initiatives that may be in our community or ideas that should be implemented locally or across the Archdiocese of Washington. I am asking our Parish Pastoral Council to assist me in answering this survey on behalf of our parish.

To help us with this task, I am going to list the survey questions and invite you to respond to the questions of the survey so that we can collect ideas and existing resources, programs, and initiatives that may be in our community or ideas that should be implemented locally or across the Archdiocese of Washington. Last week I listed the first three goals and three questions we need to answer for each of the first three goals. This week I'll list the other three goals and the questions we need to answer for them:

Goal #4: Reversing young people from leaving the Church: Reversing the avalanche of young people leaving the Church.



THE YEAR OF SAINT FRANCIS

January 10, 2026
to
January 10, 2027

A special plenary indulgence is available during the Year of Saint Francis. Proclaimed by Pope Leo XIV for the 800th anniversary of St. Francis's passing, this Jubilee allows the faithful to receive the indulgence by visiting a Franciscan church (Our Church), praying, and fulfilling standard conditions (confession, communion, prayer for the Pope).

Key details regarding the Year of Saint Francis indulgence:

- **Duration:** The indulgence is available from January 10, 2026 through January 10, 2027.
- **Purpose:** to mark the 800th anniversary of the death of St. Francis of Assisi.
- **Conditions:** To obtain the plenary indulgence, the faithful must visit a Franciscan church or shrine, participate in Jubilee celebrations or spend time in prayer, and fulfill the usual conditions of sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayers for the Pope's intentions.
- **Applicability:** The indulgence is available to all faithful, including those unable to visit in person due to illness (who can participate through spiritual offering).
- **Significance:** The decree emphasizes spiritual renewal and following the example of St. Francis in the modern world.

MINISTRY FAIR, CHURCH RENOVATION WORK MERIT LONG DISCUSSIONS AT PARISH PASTORAL MEETING

The parish Ministry Fair on January 10 seemed to be successful, with many people having expressed interest in joining liturgical and other ministries, according to a report given at the Parish Pastoral Council meeting on January 22. But the true yardstick for success will lie in how many people step forward to serve in ministry.

Council member Marianne Deausen reported that ministry coordinators had been asked to contact those people who signed up for their ministries by January 26. In giving their general observations about the ministry fair, council members suggested that January appeared to be a good month to sponsor them and that one per year is likely effective, so people will be eager to sign up. Council member Ann Pierre also noted that the ministry coordinators taking part in the Ministry Fair should look for ways to better engage the parish's Spanish-speaking community.

Under other business, the council members also heard reports on:

- **The status of renovation work at the parish.** Fr. John reported that the installation of the new heating, ventilation and air conditioning system at the Rectory is not yet complete. The new HVAC system for the church had to be rescheduled for the week of February 9, which was then pushed to March 2, because of the ice and snow left on the church roof.
- **Piano rebuild.** Father John issued a stop work order for a contractor who had been rebuilding a piano for the church over the past two years, because he hadn't made sufficient progress. Music Director Janet Pate is now looking for a used or new piano to purchase.
- **Parish Pastoral Council guidelines.** Fr. John reviewed guidelines for members of the Parish Pastoral Council, including the terms of their service. He is hoping to reinstitute the Executive Committee, which helped put together the meeting agendas.
- **Ministry reports:** Council members heard reports from the Communications Ministry, Couples for Christ, and Religious Education.
- **Archdiocesan Pastoral Plan:** Fr. John also reported that Cardinal Robert McElroy has released a six-point Archdiocesan Pastoral Plan, which the pastor said he would share with council members.

Feria de Ministerios y Obras de Renovación de la Iglesia Merecedoras de Largos Debates en la Reunión Pastoral Parroquial

La Feria de Ministerios parroquial del 10 de enero pareció ser un éxito, con muchas personas expresando interés en unirse a ministerios litúrgicos y de otro tipo, según un informe presentado en la reunión del Consejo Pastoral Parroquial el 22 de enero. Sin embargo, el verdadero criterio para medir el éxito residirá en cuántas personas se ofrezcan a servir en el ministerio.

La concejal Marianne Deausen informó que se había solicitado a los coordinadores de ministerios que contactaran a las personas que se inscribieron para sus ministerios antes del 26 de enero. Al presentar sus observaciones generales sobre la feria de ministerios, los concejales sugirieron que enero parecía ser un buen mes para patrocinarlos y que una vez al año probablemente sea efectiva, por lo que la gente estará ansiosa por inscribirse. La concejal Ann Pierre también señaló que los coordinadores de ministerios que participen en la Feria de Ministerios deberían buscar maneras de involucrar mejor a la comunidad hispanohablante de la parroquia.

Bajo otros asuntos, los concejales también escucharon informes sobre:

- **El estado de las obras de renovación en la parroquia.** El P. John informó que la instalación del nuevo sistema de calefacción, ventilación y aire acondicionado en la Rectoría aún no ha finalizado. El nuevo sistema de climatización (HVAC) de la iglesia tuvo que reprogramarse para la semana del 9 de febrero, que posteriormente se pospuso al 9 de marzo, debido al hielo y la nieve que quedaron en el techo de la iglesia.
- **Reconstrucción del piano.** La Arquidiócesis de Washington emitió una orden de suspensión de obras para un contratista que había estado reconstruyendo un piano para la iglesia durante los últimos dos años, debido a que no había avanzado lo suficiente. La directora musical, Janet Pate, busca un piano usado o nuevo para comprar.
- **Directrices del Consejo Pastoral Parroquial.** El P. John revisó las directrices para los miembros del Consejo Pastoral Parroquial, incluyendo los términos de su servicio. Espera reinstaurar el Comité Ejecutivo, que ayudó a elaborar las agendas de las reuniones.
- **Informes ministeriales:** Los miembros del consejo escucharon informes del Ministerio de Comunicaciones, Parejas para Cristo y Educación Religiosa.
- **Plan Pastoral Arquidiocesano:** El P. John también informó que el Cardenal Robert McElroy publicó un Plan Pastoral Arquidiocesano de seis puntos, el cual, según el párroco, compartiría con los miembros del consejo.
