Scripture Corner FAITH FIRST

Whenever a human being wants to develop a relationship with God, he must start with faith. In today's Gospel (John 14: 1-12) Jesus tells all, "You have faith in God; have faith also in me." (John 14: 1) Faith in Christ will lead to hope and to charity, the three theological virtues.

Faith will lead the followers of Jesus to some important relationships. Our Lord insists strongly on the unity of the Father and himself. He says to Philip, "Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me?" (John 14: 10) Christ understands the difficulty for his followers to be people of faith. Jesus asks that his followers have difficulty in being people off faith. He tells them that they "should believe because of the works themselves." (John 14: 11) Our Lord uses miracles to strengthen the faith of the early Christians, The Fourth Gospel refers to the seven miracles of Jesus as "signs."

A second important teaching by Christ is his statement, "I am the way and the truth and the life." (John 14: 6) Jesus is the WAY because he has the TRUTH that leads to everlasting LIFE. On an earlier occasion Jesus had said to "those Jews who believed in him, 'If you remain in my word, you will truly be my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." (John 8: 31-32) The special efforts being made now in the area of evangelization is a strong effort to have more and more people develop faith in Christ.

Today's Gospel has two significant promises by Jesus. 'if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back again and take you to myself, so that where I am, you also may be." (John 14: 3) A second promise comes from the love of Jesus for his followers, "Whoever believes in me will do the works that I do, and will do greater ones than these, because I am going to the Father." (John 14: 12)

THE MUSINGS OF THE PASTOR

I am happy to tell you that Cardinal Wuerl has assigned Joseph Salser, a seminarian for the Archdiocese of Washington to our parish for eight weeks for pastoral training and service this summer. Joseph will arrive on Wednesday, May 17. While he is with us this summer, Joseph will be ordained a deacon. Cardinal Wuerl will ordain him a deacon on Saturday, June 10. Joseph will be what is called a transitional deacon. That is, he is expected to be ordained to the priesthood in 2018. After he arrives I am going to ask him to write up something for the bulletin so that he can introduce himself to you. Please welcome Joseph when you see him.

As you know I announced at all the Masses last weekend that we will soon phase out the 1:00 p.m. Sunday Mass. I did this light of several things. The survey that was administered online and in church in March asked parishioners whether they preferred to keep the 8:00 a.m. or 1:00 p.m. Mass. 53% of respondents favored keeping the 8:00 a.m. Mass and 47% preferred retaining the 1:00 p.m. Mass. I decided to accept the Parish Pastoral Council's recommendation to phase out the 1:00 p.m. Mass. The change to a five-Mass schedule will go into effect on Sunday, July 2.

The 10-question survey additionally asked questions regarding why people attend the Mass they do, what changes to Mass times they might take, and what do they like best about the parish's weekend worship experience. Some of the other survey results are summarized here:

Which Sunday Mass do you normally attend?

Twenty-four percent of respondents to this question typically attend the 9:30 a.m. Mass, according to the survey results. Attendees at the 11:15 a.m. and 5 p.m. Saturday Mass took the next largest shares of the pie, with 21 percent and 20 percent of respondents attending those Masses, respectively. Those attending the 8 a.m., 1 p.m. and 5 p.m. Masses on Sunday made up more modest shares, claiming 13 percent, 12 percent and 10 percent of total respondents.

Is there any personal or family reason that drives your decision to go to the Mass you normally attend?

In this open-ended question, respondents were invited to express their reasons for attending the Mass they normally attend. Of 604 respondents who answered this question, people cited some of the following reasons:

- Convenience or time availability (101 people)
- Music, regarding either their liking of a particular musical style played at a certain Mass or their need to fulfill a music ministry at St. Francis. (55 people)
- Family, with respondents citing spending time with their families (40 people)
- Religious education (55 people)
- Work Schedule (18 people)

If you could, what changes to Mass times would you make? Please explain.

On this question, 411 people answered the inquiry. Responses fell across the board, but a number of respondents (18 total) stated the 1 p.m. Mass should be eliminated.

BUILD UP OUR CHURCH

Parishioners Improve Quality of Life for County Homeowner in Rebuilding Together Project

On April 29, more than 30 St. Francis parishioners gathered at two sites in Montgomery County to perform critical home repairs and spruce up landscaping, as part of the annual Rebuilding Together project. The initiative enables volunteers to repair a home owned by an elderly person or a person with a disability in the county.

The annual event-- which St. Francis parishioners have participated in for over a decade -- brings together young and old parishioners, novice volunteers and skilled crafts people to perform work that makes a real impact in the homeowner's quality of life. This year, approximately 13 parishioners made light to medium repairs and upgrades in the kitchen and bathroom at a house in Silver Spring, while nearly 20 others painted, planted and did general cleanup at the St. Francis of Assisi Rectory.

Rebuilding Together Ministry Coordinator Mike Rogewitz coordinated the work at the Silver Spring house and parishioner Pat O'Connor handled registration and other logistical tasks. Volunteers there trimmed bushes, edged flower beds and the lawn and patched gutters. Inside, the volunteers repaired baseboard in the kitchen, prepared and repainted this crucial room, removed an old stove and inoperable dishwasher and installed new ones, repaired cracked walls around windows, installed a new toilet seat and grab bars in a bathroom and installed a handrail from the kitchen down to the basement

At the Rectory, several members of FRED worked with Director of Youth and Young Adults Sue Lea to paint the Youth Room. They also painted the ceilings of two sitting rooms. Lastly, a small group planted perennials in the areas beside the Rectory/Office, while others weeded the rain garden and cleaned up the Stations of the Cross.

Social Concerns Minister Anthony Bosnick said that the Rebuilding Together initiative continues to be a worthwhile and popular service project for St. Francis parishioners. He added that the numbers of people volunteering for the service project enable parishioners to work at both the house and at the parish office.

"Participants in Rebuilding Together really enjoy the fellowship and camaraderie they share as they help with the housing need in Silver Spring and with the parish Rectory projects," he said. "It is a special time of service for them."

- 2) proof of reported household income (they request 2016 tax returns, but they may also consider W2's or social service letters verifying income if the tax return is unavailable).

Current Students Enrolled in Your School While income eligible students already enrolled in our school may not be the first priority, we encourage those families to still apply.
