*The First Friday devotion and the First Saturday devotion are both reparatory devotions in the Catholic Church that arose from separate private revelations. The First Friday devotion is associated with the Sacred Heart of Jesus, while the First Saturday devotion is associated with the Immaculate Heart of Mary. **The upcoming Kansas election matters!** This past Legislative Session, the Kansas Constitutional **VALUE THEM BOTH** amendment passed the Senate, but came four agonizing votes short in the House.
