August 15 is the Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is always a Holy Day of Obligation, except when this Solemnity falls on a Monday or Saturday, the obligation to attend Mass is abrogated (as noted by the USCCB). Take some time to reflect on the the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

On November 1, 1950, Bl. Pope Pius XII defined the dogma of the Assumption of Mary. Our Church, which is Mother and Teacher, waited for 20 centuries to declare this beautiful reality and truth about the Blessed Virgin Mary. However, the Assumption of Mary into heaven, body and soul, is not a new belief. Since the early centuries, the Doctors of the Church and the early Church Fathers, wrote about the logic of the privilege of our Blessed Mother's Assumption into Heaven.

Among the many writings considered to serve as proofs in this dogma, include Mary's Immaculate Conception. She is free from sin. Mary is the Mother of God and she has perpetual virginity. The doctrine of the Assumption says that at the end of her life on earth Mary was assumed, body and soul, into heaven by the power of her son, Jesus. This teaching makes sense with our Christian Catholic beliefs, because if death was the consequence of sin (Rom 6:23), the one who was conceived without sin, should not taste death. The early Church Fathers taught that she was assumed into heaven just as Enoch (Gn 5:24 and Heb 11:5), Elijah (2 Kgs 2:11), and some others who had been before her. The Holy Scripture also explained the power of God of taking us into heaven in body and soul (1 Thes 4:17 and 1 Cor 15:52).

Many non-Catholics incorrectly think that we Catholics believe that Mary "ascended" into heaven by her own power! But no, Catholics know that, only Christ, by his own power, ascended into heaven. Mary was taken up into heaven by God. She did not do it under her own power. It happened by the power of God. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) instructs us:

Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Remember: When we say "yes" to God, we are being like Mary. When we do good things for others in life, we are acting like Mary. When we love life and work to preserve it on earth, we are mirroring the life of Mary.

Finally the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death. The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians (CCC 966).

What can we learn for our practical life about this dogma of the glorious Assumption of our Blessed Mother? Here, we have some practical applications that will help us to follow the Lord Jesus Christ more faithfully, as His mother did:

Mary's Assumption gives us hope in the resurrection of our own bodies.

Mary is our heavenly mother and she always intercedes for us with Jesus, her son.

Mary loves us as her own children and she shows us how to trust.

Her humility provides us with a perfect example for living:

"My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my savior for God has looked with favor on His lowly servant" (Lk 1:46-48).
