As you and I venture on this 40-day long road of Lent to keep Jesus company as He walks determinedly to Jerusalem and to Calvary, so that He not be alone nor abandoned, we are invited to practice the Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving so that we might prioritize God through prayer, die to self through fasting and love God and our neighbor through the giving of alms. In other words, we are invited to do what Jesus Himself does: pray to God for strength and understanding, die to self by taking up our cross daily and bring new life to others by serving them in their greatest needs.
