A WORD FROM FR. LEWIS..

HS JMJ

The Third Sunday of Lent

Greetings in Christ.

"Perfect love casts out all fear. 1 John 4:18

In today's Gospel, Christ Jesus meets a Samaritan woman at the well, who goes there at a strange time for gathering water: high noon, the hottest time of the day. She has no other option, it seems, because she is afraid of the consequences of her sins. She is an outcast, because she is not living according to God's law of sexual morality: she has serially married and is presently in a morally-compromised relationship with a man who is not her husband. So, she lives in fear and shame.

Until she meets Jesus, Who is perfect Love. His mercy toward her, including the spiritual mercy of correcting her for her sinful state in life, casts out her every fear and satisfies her thirst for genuine, selfless love, inclusion, and freedom from her sins. She leaves the well a changed person, free of all fear, because she is free of her sins. This freedom inspires her to share this joyful news with her townspeople, so they, too, can become free. The woman who was once outcast has now become a disciple and evangelist, sharing with all that indeed "perfect love casts out all fear."

Because of the valid health concerns surrounding the coronavirus, the world is in great fear now. Let us who bear the name of Christ not be afraid. Rather, let us trust in the Divine Physician and beseech Him, in Whom all things are possible (Matthew 19:26), to bring His healing to our world and to cast out our fears. Let us cooperate with His Grace by exercising a calm demeanor, prudence, and common sense. Washing hands frequently with soap and water, using towels to touch handles, keeping hydrated, staying home if feeling sick are all ways of being calmly pro-active in remaining healthy and keeping others healthy. Health concerns are valid, to be sure. Nevertheless, let us follow the example of the Samaritan woman, who allowed Jesus' perfect love to cast out all fear from her heart.

Weekend and daily Masses, Religious Education classes, Sunday hospitality in the parish hall as well as all parish functions and events, including the St. Joseph's Mass (6PM) March 19 and the Fish Fry (5-7PM) and Shadow Stations (7PM) March 20, will continue uninterrupted, as we fall far below the State of Maryland's recommendations to suspend events that exceed 250 persons. Consequently, the State of Maryland considers us in the "safe zone."

Follow your personal comfort level, however, in attending parish events, and if sick or feeling ill, please remain home, even from Sunday Mass, as this particular circumstance excuses you from fulfilling the Sunday obligation. As your Priest and Servant, I encourage anyone in need of staying home due to illness to participate in the Sacred Liturgy by watching the Mass attentively on EWTN to receive the graces of a spiritual Communion, that is, the graces that come from witnessing your faith in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist.

Please know of my prayers of health and blessings for you and yours.
