A WORD FROM FR. COFFIEY...

Dear Parishioners. ~



In the first reading, Job seems to think that life is pure misery. At the end of the reading, he assures us that he shall never see happiness again. We may not realize it, but Job was an extremely upright and pious man. His afflictions and sufferings were never meant to be a punishment, but simply a test of his faith. Perhaps we think because of the current situation in our world with the virus, the political spectrum of America, and even our own

personal struggles and pains, we will never see happiness or peace again. This is simply untrue. Misery happens when we do not trust enough in Jesus. It happens when we place our trust in things of the world that will end, disappear, and do not really matter. Do we pray rather than watch the news or soak in social media? Do we spend time talking about holy and substantial things rather than gossiping? Am I confident in God's love for me and His eternal plan? It begs the guestion to ask ourselves: What part do I play in my own

When I first came to the parish, we sent out a survey to parishioners asking opinions on some items for consideration. One of these was to change our Saturday evening Mass to 4:00 PM. More than half the people voted to have this Mass at the earlier time of 4:00 PM. At the time, it was not a problem because I was able to have a steady flow of four priests helping me. Thus, the change was not necessary. However, in that short time, I am now down to only one priest helping. As you know, there is at least one and possibly two Saturdays that I need to be away every month for military duty. As time goes on, the priest shortage is not going to get any better. After consultation with the parish clergy, staff, and parish council, it is necessary that we move our 5:30 PM Saturday night Mass to 4:00 PM. This allows me to find more priests who are willing to come and help. Several priests would not help simply because they are elderly and did not like to drive when it gets dark. All the priests we have had were traveling well over an hour to come and say Mass for us. We need to be considerate of the sacrifices they are making as well as their safety. Additionally, most of the people who currently attend Saturday night Mass are elderly as well, so we as a parish are trying to be considerate of everyone's safety and well-being. With that said, we will switch our Saturday night Mass time at St. Elizabeth's next month effective on March 6th to 4 PM. Confessions will begin at 3:00 PM.

Fr. Lewis started having Adoration on Tuesdays with Benediction at 12 Noon. I think this is a wonderful opportunity for our parish. However, it has become apparent that during the pandemic roughly half of our ordinary parishioners are not coming to Mass for safety reasons. Because of this, there have been a few instances when on Tuesdays, we were not able to find enough people to be present with the Blessed Sacrament. In consultation with the clergy, staff, and parish council, we will have Benediction at 10:30 instead of 12 Noon. This will take effect on Tuesday, March 2nd. This still allows people to do a true "Holy Hour" since Mass ends at 9:30 AM. Additionally, it will allow more people to stay for the beautiful Rite of Benediction if they have several things to attend to throughout the

Thank you for your undying and loval dedication to our parish even in these changing and uncertain times. I am always praying for you!
