A WORD FROM FR. COFFIEY... Dear Parishioners ~

One of the final prayers that takes place at a child's



baptism is called the Ephphatha. It literally translates to "be opened". It is at this prayer that the priest or deacon touches the child's ears and mouth that they may both hear and speak the Word of God.

Ephphatha is mentioned in the gospel today. Jesus cures a man who is deaf and has a speech impediment. Jesus cures the man by spitting and touching his ears and tongue. In the days before Vatican II, in the Old Rite of Baptism, this was exactly what the priest did during the prayer. He would spit on his finger and touch the child's ears and mouth. Now, there is no saliva, just a simple touch.

Once the man in the gospel was cured, news about Jesus' miracle spread everywhere. This is what we are called to do. We have ears to hear the Word of God and we have a mouth to proclaim the Word of God. If we are hearing things that are not holy, pure, and good, of what use are ears? And, in the very same way, if we are not using our mouth to proclaim the truth, speak about good, holy, and pious things, why even talk?

Let us examine our daily life. What do we hear and what do we say? Are they good things? Are they things we really need to hear and speak? Is it simply gossip, idle talk, and slander? Is it profane, provocative, and crude humor? Is it things which destroy rather than build up the Body of Christ?

If it is, it's best for us not to listen nor to speak. Our ears and mouth are sacred and blessed at our baptism. Don't allow the sacred to become profaned.

I invite you all to join our three days of Forty Hours Devotions on October 7, 8, and 9th. Please plan to attend all three evenings and spend time with Our Lady, Our Lord, and our parish community! Please sign up early if you wish to attend the Mass and dinner on Saturday as this will fill up quickly! See the insert in the bulletin today and the posters around the parish facilities for a detailed schedule.

Finally, a reminder that next weekend, the Sunday morning Mass at St. Elizabeth's changes back to 11:15 AM.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS - MARYLAND STATE COUNCIL - SCHOLARSHIPS BEING OFFERED

The Maryland State Council of the Knights of Columbus is the sponsor of several High School scholarships for its members and for Catholic Students in general.
