A WORD FROM FR. COFFIEY...



We now enter into the last two weeks of Lent which is known as Passion-Tide. The readings change their tone, particularly the gospels, to focus more on the contention felt between Jesus and the hostile Jewish leaders. There becomes an intensifying danger for Jesus to perform miracles out in public and not be ridiculed or arrested. During these last two weeks you will notice all the statues and crucifixes covered in the churches. It recalls the gospel this Thursday which says: "So

they picked up stones to throw at him; but Jesus hid and went out of the temple area." The statues and crucifixes are veiled in purple cloths and "hidden" from us. It's a subtle reminder that we can often feel like we are put into dangerous and uncomfortable situations when we do good and speak the truth about God to others.

This ancient practice of veiling the crucifixes and statues also recalls the shortness of our Lenten journey and our very own life. As we age and approach the end of our life, many things will be taken away from us; our health, our good looks, our independence, our continence. So, with the Lenten journey, many things are taken away from us; food, treats, old habits, flowers and decorations in the church, statues and images of our Lord. All of this is summed up when finally, the most important and vital thing in the world is taken away from us on Good Friday: The Holy Mass. Nowhere in the world this day is a Mass celebrated. It is a compelling reminder that in the end, the only thing that will remain is the Word of God. After all, Good Friday is just a "Liturgy of the Word" with the distribution of Holy Communion consecrated the day before. But let us not fear! We know the Lord will rise and He will raise us with Him! As the prophet Ezekiel says in the first reading this weekend: "O my people, I will open your graves and have you rise from them, and bring you back to the land of Israel. Then you shall know that I am the LORD, when I open your graves and have you rise from them, O my people! I will put my spirit in you that you may live!"

Please be as generous as possible in the Second Collection this weekend which helps to pay for Easter flowers and decorations. Our Environment teams work very hard to make sure our churches are as elegant and dignified as possible to celebrate our Risen Lord!

On Holy Saturday, April 8th, there will be a blessing of Easter Food and Baskets at Noon at St. Benedict Church. All parishioners are invited to bring food and/or Easter baskets for blessing. The blessing of Easter food has been a beloved Catholic ritual for centuries among families of Eastern European origin. On Holy Saturday morning, families prepare their Easter Baskets and fill them with symbolic items. The

baskets are then brought to church to be blessed. After Easter Sunday Mass, the family and their quests share their blessed fare and exchange good wishes. The custom of blessing the Easter foods arose from the strict Lenten fasting of the past, when meat, eggs, fats, and other foods were forbidden during Lent. Easter was thus greeted with great joy as the day when Christ arose and when fasts were ended.
