Speaking of banquets and dinners...

Our first reading this weekend from Isaiah is a reading we often hear at funeral Masses. It recalls how the Lord will save us and give us the choicest of all things if we persevere to end. It juxtaposes the Kingdom of God as an eternal banquet.

The gospel also speaks about a banquet. In this case, a wedding banquet. We hear how a certain man tries to come in and is apprehended for not wearing a wedding garment. We often wonder what this means. Some of the Church Fathers relate this wedding garment to the white garment or "bib" that is placed on us by the priest or deacon at our baptism. It signifies we have become a new creation and have clothed ourselves with Christ. It also relates to the white cover or "pall" that covers our casket in the church when we die at our funeral Mass. All are invited. Not all will accept the conditions. Not all will meet expectations. Thankfully, we have all been "clothed" in Christ. When we think of the Saints, we hear from the Book of Revelation how they are the ones who are "clothed in garments of white". May we persevere, desire the eternal banquet in heaven, and be counted among the saints in heaven when we die.

Please note there will be no daily Confessions, Adoration, or Masses this week as I will be away. If there is an emergency, please call the parish office and we will try to arrange a priest to assist you in your hour of need.

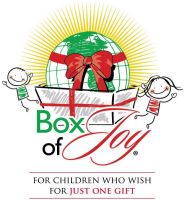
