Whose Son Is the Christ?

Both our first reading this weekend and our gospel message speak to us about placing God and others before ourselves. In other words, to observe what Jesus says are the two greatest Commandments: Loving God and neighbor. Exodus speaks about the generosity that we lend to our neighbors in need. After all, there is nothing so great as to do something kind for someone out of the goodness of your heart. It makes you feel good. It brings peace and joy. It makes you feel valued. Even if the other person cannot repay you, a simple thank you is sufficient. Sometimes, even a smile.

We certainly have no shortage of generosity in our parish. Just look at how many ministries and groups we currently have. We are constantly reaching out to others, assisting through prayers and actions those in need, and helping the poor. With all of this in mind, I am asking all of you to help our parish which is in need at this time.

The current roof on St. Elizabeth Church needs replacing as well as the gutters. Half of the roof on the church is well over 40 years old, so we certainly got our "money out of it". The roof is not leaking yet, thanks to the extremely steep pitch, but the gutters are seriously failing and causing settlement cracks in the walls. Our Maintenance Committee and Finance Council have been hard at work, reviewing contracts and choosing the best option and price for a new roofing system. They have finally settled on a contract for a new roof and gutter replacement that will cost approximately \$22,000.00. If you would like to contribute financially to help with this project, simply write a check to the parish, and drop it in the collection basket, or bring it to the parish office. If a check, please write in the memo line: ROOF. If it is cash, please write on the envelope: ROOF. We want to make sure of the proper allocation of funds.

While this is certainly a large sum of money, I know that we can "Raise the Roof" so to speak, and fully fund this worthwhile project. I thank everyone in our parish for your generous financial and spiritual contribution that truly makes our parish the Eucharistic Oasis of Faith on the Eastern Shore. \bigcirc
