Do I need a tax letter?

If the amount of your deductible 2023 donations & expenses is more than the standard deduction (standard deductions for the tax year 2023 are: \$13,850 for single and married filing separately, \$27,700 for married filing jointly, and \$20,800 for heads of households) then you should consider itemizing and requesting a tax letter from the parish would be necessary.

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR...

Dear Parishioners ~



Now that we are in the Year of St. Mark, there is a unique literary theme which is particular to his gospel. Mark uses the word "immediately" repeatedly. This word occurs in the Gospel of Mark more often than in the rest of the New Testament combined. The frequent use of the word stresses the importance of an event and helps to show that Christ's ministry has a divine purpose and plan behind it. In other words, St. Mark stresses the importance that Jesus is a man of action, not a quiet bystander. This is a blueprint for

our spiritual life. It is one thing to be at peace and be in quiet reflection. But we must get up, move, and act. We cannot just sit and wait for Jesus to do all the work. He will give us the motivation. But we are the hands, mouth, and feet to carry out his work.

Now that we are in a new year when many individuals make promises to better themselves and become more motivated, what have you done thus far to be more spiritually motivated? Do you heed Jesus' immediate action? Have you become more involved in the life of the parish? Are you sitting back waiting for Jesus or someone to get you up or ask you to do something? There is so much work to be done! Let us immediately tend to the Kingdom of God!

Lent is a little over two weeks away and begins with Ash Wednesday which is on Valentine's Day this year (February 14th). You will notice in the vestibules of both churches there are Lenten booklets and devotional materials. Please take a copy to help you as you prepare for these 40 days leading up to Easter. CAROLINE COUNTY RIGHT TO LIFE NEWS

The Caroline County Right to Life Chapter started in January 2023. We are humbly asking that members renew their annual \$15 membership for 2024 by using the form that is inserted in today's bulletin. Your dues pay for signage, human fetal models, printing costs, etc,.. for education and in our battle to defeat the so-called "Reproductive Freedom Act" amendment on the 2024 ballot. If you are not yet a member of CCRTL and would like to become one, you may fill out the same form.

You will also find an insert in today's bulletin which describes some of the effects of the "Reproductive Freedom Act", two of which are that 1) there would be NO LOWER AGE LIMIT for a child to make life-altering medical decisions without parental knowledge, and 2) this is an AMENDMENT, not a law. Amendments are much more difficult to change than laws. Please read this document and do what you can to raise your voice in the public square to defeat this Act. And, most importantly, please pray and fast that God's will be done.

Finally, Senate Bill HB0403 – the End of Life Option Act – was introduced in the Maryland State Senate this week. This bill aims to legalize physician assisted suicide in Maryland. We must raise our voices urging legislators to oppose this dangerous bill.
