Last year, on the Feast of Corpus Christi, parishioner Brett Carmean shared his Eucharistic witness story during the breakfast following the 8am Mass and Corpus Christi Eucharistic Procession. In the weeks after his presentation, all parishioners were invited to share their own Eucharistic witness stories by submitting them to the parish office via email or using the special form that was placed in the parish bulletin. As a result of that

effort, several additional witness stories were submitted, and we have compiled them into a small booklet. Copies of the booklet are available at the entrance of the churches and will also be available at this year's Corpus Christi breakfast. We hope that these witness stories will inspire and uplift you. As this year of Eucharistic Renewal in the parish comes to a close next month, we pray that you will continue to find Christ's grace and peace through the Eucharist. We will certainly continue to seek ways to help you to do that through parish liturgies and events.

As the official Eucharistic Revival website reminds us, "Revival is not something we do. It's God stirring up the hearts of His people. In response to our prayers, the Holy Spirit is filling us with grace and zeal-setting our hearts ablaze with his love and sending us out to share it with the world. The National Eucharistic Revival movement is the joyful, expectant, grassroots response of the Church in the United States to the divine invitation to be united once again around the source and summit of our faith in the celebration of the Eucharist.
