A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR....

Dear Parishioners ~



Deacon Bill, in a homily a few weeks ago, spoke about being wealthy and how it can be an all too common occurrence that someone who is rich is often never satisfied, no matter how many material goods they possess or what they can "buy" that promises to bring them happiness. He mentioned that it was St. Mother Teresa who called this a sickness. She named it: the poverty of the rich. Mother Teresa believed that there is a vicious cycle of wealth that is often

overlooked, and that the wealthy can suffer from loneliness, isolation, and poverty of the soul. She also believed that the wealthy need compassion just as much as anyone else. In both our first reading this weekend and our gospel, we hear how it is not goods, possessions, or even food that can promise us happiness, but rather our faith in God. If we have faith, we have everything.

I thank everyone who helped make our Annual Parish Christmas Bazaar a huge success! Fun, delicious food, and a "spirit" of the upcoming festive season was had by one and all! Many of our children were able to eat breakfast with Santa and Mrs. Claus and tell them what they wanted for Christmas! ① Our Parish Fundraising Committee thanks all our workers, volunteers, vendors, parishioners, bakers, parish committees and organizations, and guests for your support and patronage. Thank you!

We congratulate one of our own parishioners, Sister Amanda Marie de Jesus, who will be making her final vows in New York on November 16th as a Little Sister of the Poor. Sister's long journey has been one of intense joy and she recently wrote a nationwide publicized article about her trip to the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis. You can find the link to the article on our parish website to read about Sisters profound experience. We pray for Sister Amanda, Joe, and Dylanthe three vocations from our parish – and for more vocations to serve our Diocese and the Church-at-large. The Little Sisters home located in Newark, Delaware is requesting several items and the Knights will be collecting those items prior to all Masses both this weekend and next weekend. The Sisters thank you for your generosity in taking care of the elderly poor.

During this month of November, the month dedicated to All Souls, we are called to pray for the dead. In a particular way, the souls in purgatory. This is why after very Mass, in lieu of the St. Michael prayer, we will be saying the St. Gertrude prayer. According to tradition, St. Gertrude the Great, a 13th century German nun and mystic, was told by Jesus that reciting this prayer would release 1000 souls from purgatory. However, the Holy See has stated that the prayer is not officially indulgenced, meaning that there is no guarantee that a specific number of souls are released from purgatory by reciting it. This, however, does not mean that it has no intrinsic value. Even though we may not know the exact number of souls it may release, our prayer is vital and important. We need to help the souls in purgatory make it to heaven.
