The readings for this Second Sunday of Advent have a certain sense of anticipation and joy attached to them. As we hear in the gospel this weekend, John the Baptist's coming on the scene and his preaching changed the culture and society in his time forever. Feasting on locusts and honey, and wearing a camel hair shirt were not exactly what society was used to or what they were prepared for. But John's preparing the way for God in the flesh gave society a cause for hope, joy, and anticipation.

As we approach Christmas, are we doing the same as St. John? Are we preparing for Christ's coming by allowing our families, friends, and society to have joy and anticipation? Monday is a Holy Day of Obligation this year - The Feast of the Immaculate Conception. Masses will be celebrated at the usual 9 AM time as well as at 6 PM. Both Masses will take place at St. Elizabeth's.

Please mark your calendar for our Annual Rorate Mass on Thursday, December 12th - the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe and the Patronal Feast of the United States. The Mass will take place at St. Benedict's at 6 AM and will be celebrated Ad Orientem (facing the altar and eastward) and in total darkness except for candles. This ancient traditional Mass welcomes Christ who is the Light of the World as we prepare for Christmas. Scripture tells us that Christ will come again from the East. And so, the people and priest together face east. We will also have 8:15 AM Confessions and 9 AM Mass that morning as usual for those who cannot attend this very early Mass.

On Saturday, December 14th there will be a special Advent Reflection from 10:30-11:30 AM in the Parish Hall. One of our parishioners, Dr. Janyne Althaus, will be presenting the topic: "Are You Tired Yet?" Dr. Althaus is a Maternal Fetal Medicine specialist whose practice focuses on caring for women with complicated or highrisk pregnancies here on the Eastern Shore. Dr. Althaus will help you discern God's perfect plan for you. Start the new year off with a daring new way to look at the world, find your purpose, and re-commit your life to the glory and wonder that is life in Christ. This is a pertinent topic for the hectic holiday season and the upcoming New Year you don't want to miss. Coffee and light refreshments will be served.

Now that we are nearly halfway through Advent, it is a good time to think about a special person who has been away from the Church or Christ for a very long time. Perhaps you can ask them now to come with you to one of the several Christmas Masses so they can experience peace and the love of Christ.


FEAST OF IMMACULATE CONCEPTION
