A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR...

Dear Parishioners ~



Our first reading this weekend from Sirach gives us good advice in life: "Praise no one before he speaks, for it is then that people are tested." Sirach gives a foundational principle to examine other individuals. This information is crucial because simple first impressions and hearsay mean nothing in the greater machination of one's character. In fact, Sirach tells us how a person's true "colors" will be manifested: when trials and tribulations affect their life. He says: "When a sieve is shaken,

the husks appear; so, do one's faults when one speaks." Have you ever experienced this with someone you have thought was a good person or a true friend only to find out when misfortunes or challenges happened to them, they were not the reputable decent individual you once thought? The famous country music artist Tracy Lawrence once wrote a song capturing this idea: You find out who your friends are!

When we examine our own lives, are we the same person in good times and bad times? Does our demeanor change when we feel the closeness of God or when we feel He is far away from us? Are we two-faced and duplicitous? Do we produce results and carry out what we say we will do? Or do we only help when it's of advantage to us? Do we trust in the Lord in ALL times?
