A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR...

Dear Parishioners ~



Have you ever wondered why on Sundays we have people "bring up the gifts" of the bread and wine to the altar? Well, we get this ancient tradition from our first reading today in which Moses speaks to the people and says the priest shall receive the basket from you and set it upon the altar, where inside is contained the first-fruits of the soil. Originally, the early Church would bake their own bread and ferment

their own wine to be offered for the Eucharistic Sacrifice at Mass. Nowadays, it is much easier to just purchase the bread and wine from a catalog. It was to be made of the finest wheat flour and the most succulent ripe grapes possible. Showing that the congregation was offering their very best or their "first-fruits" to God. Even though we don't use a wicker basket to bring up the gifts, we place the hosts in what is called a *ciborium*. This derives its name from the word *cibus* which means food in Latin. It is therefore best described as the container that holds the food-the food from heaven. The Holy Eucharist.

During Lent, we have the opportunity to "Return to the Lord". Please remember we have confessions before all our daily Masses as well as on Saturday afternoons. This is the perfect way to experience the upcoming Resurrection.

Every Friday we have Stations of the Cross during Lent at 7:00 PM. Please consider coming to pray and to meditate on Jesus' Sacred passion and suffering. Always check the bulletin as the location alternates weekly.

Our Gaelic and Garlic event is on Sunday, March 16th at 4:00 PM in the Parish Hall to celebrate St. Paddy's and St. Joseph's Feast Days. We will feature a chili cook off contest, homemade delicious Italian desserts, as well as fun for the whole family.
