# A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR....

Dear Parishioners ~

The theme of the Second Sunday of Lent is light. We hear about Christ revealing Himself to His chosen apostles and appearing as a manifestation of light in this weekend's account of the Transfiguration. Light plays a significant role for the season of Lent because it is symbolically seen as a time of being in the tomb with Christ, allowing ourselves to die with Christ by getting rid of the things that separate ourselves from Him. When we come out of Lent, just as Christ came out of the tomb, it will be a Resurrection experience. We will experience light because we will be freed of those things that kept us in darkness, from seeing God fully.

On this Second Sunday of Lent, Bishop Koening asks everyone in our parish to bring light to those who are living in darkness, whether it be because of a lack of resources, food, shelter, education, or finances, by supporting the 2025 Faith & Charity Annual Appeal. The theme for this year is "Together in Hope". Your donation, whether big or small, helps over 40 crucial ministries in our Diocese continue their work by being beacons of hope. You will be asked at Mass to fill out a pledge card. Thank you for your help, support, and prayers. The theme for the third Sunday of Lent is repentance. The understanding that tragedy and misfortune happens to those who sin was quite common in the time that Christ lived. In fact, it still is today. When tornadoes, wildfires, tragic sudden deaths happen, some people associate these events with the "end times". Jesus mentions this "superstition" in the gospel when He talks about the tower of Siloam collapsing and killing 18 people. It wasn't because God was punishing these people. Rather, Jesus stresses the importance of always being prepared to meet God and the end by repenting and turning back to Him. Thank goodness, we can do this every time we go to confession. We never know when the end of our life will happen. But we can always be prepared.

Please don't forget to purchase some delicious homemade chocolate Easter Eggs from our Youth Group. You have your choice of either coconut, peanut butter, or butter cream. They are only \$4 a piece, while supplies last. They freeze well and make a tasty treat or gift for a special someone to remember Jesus' Resurrection. always sell out, so get your eggs early! They will be for sale after weekend Masses and in the parish hall on Sunday mornings. Thank you in advance for your support!


