Receiving Sacraments: the Diocese requires your student to actively take part in religious formation sessions for at least two successive years prior to a Sacramental year. This means that if your student is in eighth (8<sup>th</sup>) grade this year, in order for him/her to be confirmed when our parish holds confirmation (10<sup>th</sup> grade), they must be registered and actively participate in ninth (9<sup>th</sup>) and tenth (10<sup>th</sup>) grade religious education classes as well as register and actively participate in the confirmation program. Same goes for First Reconciliation and First Eucharist. Your child must be enrolled and actively participate in first (1<sup>st</sup>) and second (2<sup>nd</sup>) grade religious ed and register and actively participate in the sacramental prep program too. Please do not hesitate to reach out to me if you have any questions.
