CATECHISM CORNER

The liturgical commemoration of the **Passion or Beheading of St. John the Baptist** is almost as old as that commemorating his

Nativity, which is one of the oldest feasts, if not the oldest
introduced into both the Eastern and Western liturgies to honor a
saint. The day commemorates his martyrdom by beheading on the
orders of Herod Antipas, tetrarch or sub-king of Galilee under the
Roman Empire. The Roman Catholic Church celebrates the feast on
August 29.

According to the Synoptic Gospels, Herod had imprisoned John because he reproved Herod for divorcing his wife and unlawfully taking Herodias, the wife of his brother Herod Philip I. On Herod's birthday, Herodias' daughter (traditionally named Salome) danced before the king and his guests. Her dancing pleased Herod so much that in his drunkenness he promised to give her anything she desired, up to half of his kingdom. When the daughter asked her mother what she should request, she was told to ask for the head of John the Baptist on a platter. Although Herod was appalled by the request, he reluctantly agreed and had John executed in the prison.

The Jewish historian Flavius Josephus also relates in his Antiquities of the Jews that Herod killed John, stating that he did so, "lest the great influence John had over the people might put it into his [John's] power and inclination to raise a rebellion, (for they seemed ready to do anything he should advise), [so Herod] thought it best [to put] him to death." He further states that many of the Jews believed that the military disaster which fell upon Herod at the hands of Aretas his former father-in-law, was God's punishment for his unrighteous behavior. None of the sources give an exact date, which was probably in the years 30-35, and according to Josephus the death took place at the fortress of Machaerus.
