Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples should call the parish office at least six (6) months prior to the anticipated date of the marriage. At least one member of the couple should be a registered and practicing member of the parish for at least six (6) months.

Sacrament of Baptism

On Wednesday, September 14th, we will celebrate the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, reminding ourselves that the death of Jesus was not the final word. On Thursday, we will celebrate the feast of the 7 Sorrows of Mary, Our Mother of Sorrows.

As you enter the church of Our Mother of Sorrows, you are immediately drawn to the carved statue of Mary on the front wall of the sanctuary. On the other side of the tabernacle are 7 tears that are falling. These 7 tears stand for the 7 sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Maybe there were more sorrows in her life, but these 7 really seem to stand out.

- 1. The Presentation of Jesus in the Temple. This is a sorrow because Simeon tells Mary that a sword shall pierce her heart and that Jesus would be the source of the rise and fall of Israel.
- 2. The flight into Egypt. Mary and Joseph have to pack up everything and flee because King Herod is trying to kill the baby Jesus.
- 3. The loss of Jesus in the Temple. Mary and Joseph search for Jesus for 3 days before finally finding him.
- 4. The Way of Calvary.
- 5. The Crucifixion
- 6. Taking of Jesus body from the cross.
- 7. Burial of Jesus in the tomb.

As you can see, there were many events in the life of Mary that caused her pain and sorrow. When we pray the stations during Lent, many times we will sing the Stabat Mater which is the song of the sorrows of Mary along the Via Dolorosa. It is good for us to remember just how much Mary and Jesus suffered in their lives. When we are tempted to be filled with self-pity we must remember that even the Son of God and his mother were not exempt from pain suffering and even death. We can go to them when we need help to deal with the things giving us hardship. God be praised.
